WHEREAS, under the provisions of Article VI, Section 20 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974 and R.S. 33:1324.1, a political subdivision may exercise and perform any authorized power and function, including financing, jointly or in cooperation with one or more political subdivisions, and

WHEREAS, it is the objective of The Communications District and The Fire Districts to utilize the enhanced 911 Telephone System within Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana to provide direct dispatch for emergency fire calls received via 9-1-1, and

WHEREAS, all things necessary or proper to render this Agreement ("Agreement") a valid and binding obligation of The Communications District and The Fire Districts have been done, and the signing, sealing, execution and delivery thereof has been in all respects duly authorized;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth to be kept and performed by the parties hereto, it is agreed by and between the parties, as follows:

ARTICLE I.

RESPONSIBILITY OF THE COMMUNICATIONS DISTRICT

- 1.1 In order to utilize the enhanced 911 Telephone System within Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana to provide direct dispatch for fire service response calls received by 911, The Communications District agrees to:
 - 1.1.1 Designate in writing a person to act as The Communications District's representative with respect to the services to be rendered under this agreement. Such person shall have complete authority for coordination with The Fire Districts and to transmit and receive information on behalf of The Communications District. (See Exhibit B)

- 1.1.2 Pay the cost of furnishing, installing and maintaining all enhanced9-1-1 equipment and telephone service.
- 1.1.3 Be responsible for the cost of training, seminars, and accommodation expenditures incurred in the initial and continuing training of The Communications District's personnel.
- 1.1.4 Provide fire dispatch services meeting Property Insurance Association of Louisiana (PIAL) and National Fire Protection Association ("NFPA") Guidelines for 9,999 alarms per year or less and Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA's) National Incident Management System protocol.
- 1.1.5 Dispatch emergency fire calls in accordance with The Terrebonne Parish Communications District's E-911 System Standard Operating Guidelines.
- 1.1.6 Invoice The Fire Districts for services on an annual basis.
- 1.1.7 Provide respective fire department alert page tone and primary dispatch information as depicted in departmental provided protocol. (See Exhibit C)

ARTICLE II.

RESPONSIBILITY OF THE FIRE DISTRICTS

- 2.1 In order to utilize the enhanced 9-1-1 Telephone System within Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana to provide direct dispatch for fire service response calls received by 911, The Fire Districts agree to:
 - 2.1.1 Designate in writing a person to act as The Fire Districts' representative and with respect to such person provide:

- a) The Fire District's mailing address, telephone number and facsimile number;
- b) The Fire District Representative's home telephone number, mobile telephone number, pager number, work telephone number, work facsimile number and valid email address.
- 2.1.2 Each Fire District shall pay the annual fee as set out on Exhibit "A" within forty-five (45) days of the receipt of the invoice from The Communications District.
- 2.1.3 Follow Responder Radio Protocol as established in The Terrebonne Parish Communications District's E-911 System Standard Operating Guidelines as approved by majority vote of the Terrebonne Fire Chief's Association.
- 2.1.4 Obtain and maintain a Federal Communications Commission Radio Frequency License and the necessary pagers, mobiles, portables and base stations to receive dispatching.
- 2.1.5 Provide the following information and immediately notify The Communications Dist. in writing of any subsequent changes and/or additions:
- a) Telephone and facsimile numbers of each station and substation;
 - b) All station assignments;
 - c) All unit and apparatus assignments;
- d) The name, contact telephone number, pager tone, unit number and pager number for each unit.

2.1.6 Update/approve departmental protocol information prior to the end of the first month of each year or at a minimum two weeks prior to enacting changes with dispatch procedures. (See Exhibit C)

ARTICLE III.

INSURANCE

- 3.1 Each party shall secure and maintain, at its expense, such insurance that will protect it, and the parties from claims under the Workers' Compensation Acts and from claims of bodily injury, death or property damage which may arise from the performance of services under this Agreement. Each Party shall also secure and maintain a Comprehensive General Liability (CGL) policy to protect from any injury, death or property damage with limits not less than One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) for one person, and not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for any one occurrence. The insurance for property damage shall be in the minimum amount of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for each accident.
- 3.2 In lieu thereof, each Party may carry a \$500,000 Combined Single Limit (CSL) policy with at least a \$1,000,000 aggregate.
- 3.3 Each policy holder will endorse Contractual Liability to protect the other party from the comprehensive general liability assumed under the agreement.
- 3.4 Each party shall have endorsed to all policies Waivers of Subrogation, a 30-day Notice of Cancellation, and respective parties listed as Additional Insured.
- 3.5 All policies of insurance shall be with a carrier that is no less than A++ rating.

ARTICLE IV.

DURATION OF AGREEMENT

4.1 It is recognized by the parties hereto, that this agreement shall become effective January 1, 2017 and shall remain in full force and effect through December 31, 2017, unless terminated in accordance with the provisions of Article VI.

ARTICLE V.

TERMINATION

- 5.1 This Agreement shall terminate upon the occurrence of any of the following:
- a) The Fire Districts may terminate this Agreement if The Communications District defaults on any obligation set out herein, and the Fire Districts shall be entitled to a refund of 1/365 of the annual fee for each day remaining on the term of the agreement.
- b) The Communications District may terminate this Agreement as to all Fire Districts if any of The Fire Districts default on any obligation set out herein, unless the remaining Fire Districts agree to pay the annual fee of the defaulting Fire District(s). Alternatively, upon default of any one certain district, fire dispatch services for that district may be discontinued, and all calls for service will be routed via seven (7) digit telephone lines to that district's administrative line.
 - c) This agreement shall terminate if all parties mutually agree, in writing.

ARTICLE VI.

PLEDGE OF COOPERATION

The parties hereto pledge their mutual cooperation in complying with the terms of the Agreement, all to the end that the health and welfare of the residents of Terrebonne Parish shall be promoted and that the needs of said residents for emergency telephone response may be satisfactorily met.

ARTICLE VII.

SEVERABILITY

7.1 In the event any one or more provisions of this Agreement is for any reason held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provision hereof, but the Agreement shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provisions had never been contained in this agreement. In the event that legislation enacted after the date of this Agreement validates or makes legal any provisions hereof, said legislation shall be deemed to apply hereto.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this agreement to be executed in multiple counterparts, and by the parties hereto on separate counterparts, each of which shall be deemed as an original, all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

The term of a District Office Lease or Amendment for the 115th Congress may not commence prior to January 3, 2017.

Members should endeavor to lease space through the last day of a congressional term rather than the last day of a calendar year. For the 115th Congress, leases should end on January 2, 2019, not December 31, 2018.

A few things to keep in mind:

- A. The Member/Member-Elect is required to personally sign the documents.
- B. The Member/Member-Elect must indicate in Section A ("Lease Amenities") of the Attachment whether the proposed leased space will serve as a flagship district office.
- C. The Lessor must complete the amenities checklist in Section A ("Lease Amenities"), unless the checkbox at the top of the amenities checklist is marked to indicate that amenities are listed elsewhere in the Lease.
- D. Broadband/cable availability can be confirmed by visiting <u>www.broadbandmap.gov</u> and entering the address of the proposed leased space.
- E. Section B ("Additional Terms and Conditions") of the Attachment SHALL NOT have any provisions deleted or changed.
- F. Even if rent is zero, an Attachment is still required.

- H. Once signed by both parties, the Lease or Amendment and the Attachment must be submitted to the Administrative Counsel for final approval. The Attachment should be submitted at the same time the Lease or Amendment is sent to the Administrative Counsel. They may be sent by email in PDF form or faxed to (202-225-6999).
- I. Without a properly signed and submitted Attachment, the Lease or Amendment cannot be approved and payments will not be made. The parties agree that any charges for default, early termination or cancellation of the Lease or Amendment which result from actions taken by or on behalf of the Lessee shall be the sole responsibility of the Lessee, and are not reimbursable from the Member's Representational Allowance.

SECTION B (Additional Terms and Conditions)

- 1. Incorporated District Office Lease Attachment. Lessor (Landlord) and Lessee (Member/Member-Elect of the U.S. House of Representatives) agree that this District Office Lease Attachment ("Attachment") is incorporated into and made part of the Lease ("Lease") and, if applicable, District Office Lease Amendment ("Amendment") to which it is attached.
- 2. Performance. Lessor expressly acknowledges that neither the U.S. House of Representatives (the "House") nor its Officers are liable for the performance of the Lease. Lessor further expressly acknowledges that payments made by the Chief Administrative Officer of the House (the "CAO") to Lessor to satisfy Lessee's rent obligations under the Lease which payments are made solely on behalf of Lessee in support of his/her official and representational duties as a Member of the House shall create no legal obligation or liability on the part of the CAO or the House whatsoever. Lessee shall be solely responsible for the performance of the Lease and Lessor expressly agrees to look solely to Lessee for such performance.
- 3. Modifications. Any amendment to the Lease must be in writing and signed by the Lessor and Lessee. Lessor and Lessee also understand and acknowledge that the Administrative Counsel for the CAO ("Administrative Counsel") must review and give approval of any amendment to the Lease prior to its execution.
- 4. Compliance with House Rules and Regulations. Lessor and Lessee understand and acknowledge that the Lease shall not be valid, and the CAO will not authorize the disbursement of funds to the Lessor, until the Administrative Counsel has reviewed the Lease to determine that it complies with the Rules of the House and the Regulations of the Committee on House Administration, and approved the Lease by signing the last page of this Attachment.
- 5. Payments. The Lease is a fixed term lease with monthly installments for which payment is due in arrears on or before the end of each calendar month. In the event of a payment dispute, Lessor agrees to contact the Office of Finance of the House at 202-225-7474 to attempt to resolve the dispute before contacting Lessee.
- 6. Void Provisions. Any provision in the Lease purporting to require the payment of a security deposit shall have no force or effect. Furthermore, any provision in the Lease purporting to vary the dollar amount of the rent specified in the Lease by any cost of living clause, operating expense clause, pro rata expense clause, escalation clause, or any other adjustment or measure during the term of the Lease shall have no force or effect.
- 7. **Certain Charges.** The parties agree that any charge for default, early termination or cancellation of the Lease which results from actions taken by or on behalf of the Lessee shall be the sole responsibility of the Lessee, and shall not be paid by the CAO on behalf of the Lessee.
- 8. Death, Resignation or Removal. In the event Lessee dies, resigns or is removed from office during the term of the Lease, the Clerk of the House may, at his or her sole option, either: (a)

terminate the Lease by giving thirty (30) days' prior written notice to Lessor; or (b) assume the obligation of the Lease and continue to occupy the premises for a period not to exceed sixty (60) days following the certification of the election of the Lessee's successor. In the event the Clerk elects to terminate the Lease, the commencement date of such thirty (30) day termination notice shall be the date such notice is delivered to the Lessor or, if mailed, the date on which such notice is postmarked.

- 9. Term. The term of the Lease may not exceed the constitutional term of the Congress to which the Lessee has been elected. The Lease may be signed by the Member-Elect before taking office. Should the Member-Elect not take office to serve as a Member of the 115th Congress, the Lease will be considered null and void.
- 10. Early Termination. If either Lessor or Lessee terminates the Lease under the terms of the Lease, the terminating party agrees to promptly file a copy of any termination notice with the Office of Finance, U.S. House of Representatives, O'Neill Federal Building, Suite 3220, Attn: Levi Matthews, Washington, D.C. 20515, and with the Administrative Counsel by e-mail at leases@mail.house.gov.
- 11. Assignments. Lessor shall not have the right to assign (by operation of law or otherwise) any of its rights, interests and obligations under the Lease, in whole or in part, without providing thirty (30) days prior written notice to Lessee, and any such purported assignment without such notice shall be void. Lessor shall promptly file a copy of any such assignment notice with the Administrative Counsel by e-mail at leases@mail.house.gov.
- 12. Sale or Transfer of Leased Premises. Lessor shall provide thirty (30) days prior written notice to Lessee in the event (a) of any sale to a third party of any part of the leased premises, or (b)

 Lessor transfers or otherwise disposes of any of the leased premises, and provide documentation evidencing such sale or transfer in such notice. Lessor shall promptly file a copy of any such sale or transfer notice with the Administrative Counsel by e-mail at leases@mail.house.gov.
- 13. Bankruptcy and Foreclosure. In the event (a) Lessor is placed in bankruptcy proceedings (whether voluntarily or involuntarily), (b) the leased premises is foreclosed upon, or (c) of any similar occurrence, Lessor agrees to promptly notify Lessee in writing. Lessor shall promptly file a copy of any such notice with the Office of Finance, U.S. House of Representatives, O'Neill Federal Building, Suite 3220, Attn: Levi Matthews, Washington, D.C. 20515, and with the Administrative Counsel by e-mail at leases@mail.house.gov.
- 14. Estoppel Certificates. Lessee agrees to sign an estoppel certificate relating to the leased premises (usually used in instances when the Lessor is selling or refinancing the building) upon the request of the Lessor. Such an estoppel certificate shall require the review of the Administrative Counsel, prior to Lessee signing the estoppel certificate. Lessor shall promptly provide a copy of any such estoppel certificate to the Administrative Counsel by e-mail at leases@mail.house.gov.

- **Electronic Funds Transfer.** Lessor agrees to accept monthly rent payments by Electronic Funds Transfer and agrees to provide the Office of Finance, U.S. House of Representatives, with all banking information necessary to facilitate such payments.



The constitutional norm for the lawful use of public funds and property is found in the Louisiana Constitution, Article VII, Section 14 (1974). Paragraph (A) generally prohibits the loan, pledge or donation of the "funds, credit, property, or things of value of the state or of any political subdivision."

Exceptions to the above prohibition are found within paragraph (B) and include "the use of public funds for programs of social welfare for the aid and support of the needy."

Paragraph (C) authorizes the state and its political subdivisions to engage in cooperative endeavors" for a public purpose with other government agencies, public or private corporations, or individuals. However, the authorization of cooperative endeavors for a public purpose is violated whenever a political subdivision seeks to give up something of value in the absence of a legal obligation to do so. Furthermore, any such contemplated use of public funds and property must also create a public benefit proportionate to its cost.

Accordingly, the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government (TPCG) has established the policy of the TPCG that cosponsorship of events may be authorized by the Council, within budget, for the following situations:

- (i) The EVENT serves a public purpose for the expenditure or transfer that comports with the governmental purpose the public entity has legal authority to pursue; and
- (ii) that the expenditure or transfer, taken as a whole, does not appear to be gratuitous; and
- (iii) that the public entity has a demonstrable, objective, and reasonable expectation of receiving at least equivalent value in exchange for the expenditure or transfer of public funds.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, that Keith Hamptom be appointed to the position of Terrebonne Parish Council Minute Clerk, and that the salary of the aforementioned individual be set as follows:

Grade 107 Minute Clerk \$14.29 an hour

SECTION II

If any word, clause, phrase, section or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, the remaining words, clauses, phrases, sections and other portions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect, the provisions of this ordinance hereby being declared to be severable.

Furthermore, any such contemplated use of public funds and property must also create a public benefit proportionate to its cost.

Accordingly, the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government (TPCG) has established the policy of the TPCG that cosponsorship of events may be authorized by the Council, within budget, for the following situations:
