WHEREAS, every 68 seconds, an American is sexually assaulted and every 9 minutes, that victim is a child; and

WHEREAS, 9 out of every 10 víctíms of rape are female; and

WHEREAS, 94% of women who are raped experience symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) during the two weeks following and 30% of women report symptoms of PTSD 9 months after the rape; and

WHEREAS, 33% of women who are raped contemplate suicide and 13% of women who are raped attempt suicide; and

WHEREAS, out of every 100 rapes, 40 are reported, 10 lead to an arrest, 8 are prosecuted, 4 lead to a conviction, 3 rapists will spend a day in prison and 97 rapists will walk away free, and

WHEREAS, in the year of 2022, The Haven answered 165 hotline sexual violence crisis calls and served 73 primary survivors of sexual violence with 184 individual therapy sessions, 73 group therapy sessions, and 69 survivors receiving medical advocacy; and

WHEREAS, victims should have support to find the compassion, comfort, and healing they need, and sexual perpetrators should be punished to the full extent of the law, while important partnerships have been formed among criminal justice agencies, allied professionals, and victim services to assist victims of sexual violence and their families; and

WHEREAS, it is important to recognize the compassion and dedication of the individuals who provide services to victims of sexual violence and work to increase public awareness of sexual violence and its prevalence, and to eliminate it through prevention and education; and

WHEREAS, our Parish has a moral obligation to work on the prevention of sexual assaults and the severe trauma it causes to those affected; and

MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSITION

ORDINANCE NO._____

AN ORDINANCE TO RESTRUCTURE CHAPTER 12, OF THE TERREBONNE PARISH CODE BY ADOPTING SECTION 12-75 THROUGH SECTION 12-79 TO CONSTRUCT BORROW PITS

WHEREAS, Section 1-06 of the Home Rule Charter for Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government (TPCG) provides that the Parish Government shall have the right, power and authority to pass all ordinances requisite or necessary to promote, protect and preserve the general welfare, safety, health, peace and good order of the parish, including but not by way of limitation, the right, power and authority to pass ordinances on all subject matters necessary requisite or proper for the management of parish affairs, and all other subject matters without exception, subject only to the limitation that the same shall not be inconsistent with the Constitution or expressly denied by general law applicable to the parish; and

WHEREAS, Section 2-11 of the Terrebonne Parish Home Rule Charter requires an ordinance to adopt or amend an administrative code: and

WHEREAS, TPCG is in need of adopting Article 12, Sections 75-79 to construct and regulate Borrow Pits in the parish.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Terrebonne Parish Council on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government that:

SECTION I

The following sections of the Code of Ordinances of Terrebonne Parish at Chapter 12 shall be and are hereby adopted, with underline to show additions:

Sec. 12-75 – Definitions

- (a) Borrow Pit For the purposes of this ordinance, a Borrow Pit, a term used in construction and civil engineering, is defined as an area created or dug for the extraction and sale of earthen material which will be used for fill at another location or to build/strengthen levees. A coastal use permit and coastal impact certificate are always required for Borrow Pits. The provisions of this ordinance are applicable.
- (b) Pond For the purposes of this ordinance, a pond is defined as a small area created for the extraction of earthen material to be used for fill on the property in which the material is extracted to elevate the foundation for a structure on the property. It may also be used for recreational purposes, such as swimming pools, fishing pond, or aesthetics such as a small body of still water, a garden pond, for example, formed naturally or dug on one's one property, but in any case, not to exceed one (1) acre in size with less than 5,000 Cubic Yards (CY) of material removed. If 5,000 CY or more of material are removed from the pond, a Coastal Impact Certificate will be required.

Sec. 12-76 – Safety and Damages

(a) <u>The property owner of the borrow pit site shall be responsible for implementation and installation of all measures to safeguard the public. These measures shall include but are not limited to the posting of warning signs around the borrow pit site. At a minimum, such signs shall be 24" x 36" and shall contain all of the following words: "Warning – Borrow Pit" "No Trespassing" "No Fishing" "No Swimming" "Beware of Alligators".</u>

- (b) <u>The property owner of the borrow pit site shall be liable for and assume all responsibility</u> for ensuring public safety during excavation of the borrow pit and after excavation activities have ceased and/or the borrow pit is abandoned.
- (c) <u>The property owner of the borrow pit site shall be liable for and assume all responsibility</u> for damages incurred by adjacent residential and commercial structures to slabs, foundations, walls, etc., caused by the operation of heavy equipment, including dump trucks and excavators, at, around, or in the borrow pit during excavation activities.

Sec. 12-77 – Archaeological, Historical, or Cultural Resources

 (a) If archaeological, historical, paleontological, or other cultural resources are encountered or suspected as such during activities authorized by this ordinance, work shall cease and the permittee/operator shall immediately notify the Division of Archaeology, Department of Culture, Recreation, and Tourism [CRT, P.O. Box 44247, Baton Rouge, LA 70804; (225) 342-8200)] and the Office of Coastal Management in the Department of Natural Resources [(P.O. Box 44487, Baton Rouge, LA 70804-4487; (225) 342-7591)] as well as the Local Coastal Zone Management Program (985-873-6889). Work may not resume until written approval is obtained from CRT.

Sec. 12-78 – Environmental Compliance

(a) The property owner of the proposed borrow pit site is responsible for compliance with all environmental regulations and permitting requirements under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the Louisiana Department of Natural Resources, the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality, and the Environmental Protection Agency, and obtaining all required permits from these agencies, as well as paying any compensatory mitigation imposed for permanent adverse impacts to wetlands or jurisdictional waters (Waters of the United States) and the payment of any fees and/or fines associated with the issuance of After-the-Fact permits.

Sec. 12-79 – Application for Coastal Impact Certificate for Borrow Pits.

(a) Borrow Pits may be placed no closer than 75 feet from the site's property lines, or any parish road right-of-way (ROW), any local road/street ROW, or any ROW or servitude for a critical redundant parish levee (named below) except that Borrow Pits may be placed no closer than 150 feet from the following:

- 1. State highway ROWs;
- 2. Platted residential subdivisions or existing residential structures;
- 3. <u>Rights-of-way for the Morganza Hurricane Levee Protection System or borrow</u> <u>canal servitudes.</u>
- (b) Critical redundant parish levees include the following:
 - <u>1.</u> Ward 7 5-1 Levee;
 - 2. Montegut 4-8 Levee;
 - 3. Pointe aux Chenes 4-1 Levee;
 - 4. Thompson Road Extension (East Houma Surge Levee);
 - 5. Ashland North Levee;
 - <u>6.</u> <u>Levees on the western side of Lake Boudreaux (Cane Break, Suzie Canal, NFL South);</u>
 - 7. Lower Lacache Levee;
 - 8. Industrial Road/Chabert Hospital Levee;
 - 9. Shrimpers Row Levee;
 - 10. Mayfield Levee;
 - 11. Lower Dularge Levees (East and West);
 - <u>12. Concord Levee; and</u>
 - 13. Bush Canal Levee.

- (c) <u>A borrow pit may be placed no closer than 200 feet from wetlands, including</u> <u>Bottomland Hardwoods, and natural surface waters.</u>
- (d) <u>A Borrow Pit operator or agent may apply in writing to the Terrebonne Parish President</u> for a variance from these distance restrictions based on the size and shape of the proposed Borrow Pit site and supported by engineering analysis including soil stability analysis prepared by a Louisiana licensed engineer. The variance may not be based on financial hardship. Upon favorable recommendation by the Parish President, and favorable approval by the Parish Council by an affirmative vote, the Parish Council at its discretion may grant the variance by ordinance.
- (e) <u>The Borrow Pit operator shall provide adequate dust and mud control on site and ensure that all vehicles and trailers are hosed down to remove excess dirt and mud before entering a public ROW or roadway. The operator is also responsible for and shall keep public ROWs and roadways free of dirt and mud for one-half mile in either direction and follow all state and local signage and permitting requirements.</u>
- (f) <u>The Borrow Pit operator shall comply with a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan</u> (SWPPP) approved by the parish Engineering Division when conducting clearing or earthwork operations. The SWPPP shall include erosion control feature in addition to other components which may be required by the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (LDEQ) and/or the Louisiana Department of Natural Resources (LDNR). The Borrow Pit operator shall prevent the transmission of soil particles into streams, canals, bayous, lakes or other waterways.
- (g) Borrow Pits shall be designed with a side slope of 1 foot vertical for each 3-foot horizontal run to a depth of ten (10) feet. A variance application from this side slope requirement may be made in the manner provided in (d) above. The variance may not be based on financial hardship.
- (h) Upon completion of the Borrow Pit, if there is a possibility to encompass the Borrow Pit into a forced drainage system for drainage retention purposes as well as other purposes designed to accrue to the benefit of the public, such as recreation, the parish may initiate negotiations with the property owner for maintenance, ingress and egress, and any other feature or component deemed necessary for drainage and /or recreational purposes, including the rights to be retained by the property owner.
- (i) Where access to a proposed Borrow Pit cannot be provided except by residential local or residential collector streets, the issuance of the Coastal Impact Certificate will be predicated upon receipt of engineering documentation of pre-construction (borrow pit) roadway conditions (including roadway surface and roadside drainage ditches), the provision of a plan in the application to return these streets and drainage ditched to pre-construction conditions when the pit is closed or abandoned, and receipt of a surety bond which will guarantee completion of any needed repairs if the applicant defaults or otherwise fails to perform the needed roadway/drainage repairs. The amount of the surety bond shall be determined by the Parish President, or by his designated department designee, and any other needed legal documents as determined by the parish legal department.
- (j) <u>The applicant for the Borrow Pit Coastal Impact Certificate will also provide a traffic plan</u> map showing primary access (truck haul routes) to and from the site within two (2) miles of the Borrow Pit. This truck haul route map shall be supplied to the Terrebonne Parish <u>School Board Administration, the Terrebonne Parish Sheriff's Office, and the Parish</u> <u>Public Works Department for their review and comment.</u>
- (k) <u>The Borrow Pit operator will provide adequate truck/equipment parking on the pit site</u> to ensure no truck queuing on public ROWs or roads.
- (I) <u>No materials shall be stored on any access roads or within any of the distance buffers</u> provided in Sec. 12-79 (a), (b), and (c) above.

SECTION II

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, that, in due, regular and legal sessions convened, this ordinance is adopted.

SECTION III

NOW, LET IT FURTHER BE ORDAINED any section, clause, paragraph, provision, or portion of these regulations found to be invalid is severable and shall not affect the validity of the whole.

In accordance with Arricle VII, Section 14 of the 1974 Constitution of the State of Louisiana (Constitution), the STATE OF LOUISIANA (State), herein represented by ROGER E. HUSSER, JR., DIRECTOR, FACILITY PLANNING AND CONTROL, DIVISION OF ADMINISTRATION (DOA), and TERREBONNE PARISH (Entity), a political subdivision of the State, herein represented by GORDON E. ARTICLE 1

1.3 WHEREAS, if applicable, the Entity has supplied the State with evidence of the availability and commitment of Local, Federal or Non-State Matching Funds for the Project, as set forth in the Funding Summary; and

1.4 WHEREAS, the State appropriated State General Fund (Direct) or other sources of cash for the Project or the Bond Commission did grant a cash line of credit and/or a non-cash line of credit for the Project in the amount(s) as stated in the Funding Summary; and

1.5 WHEREAS, the Act provides that all of the funds appropriated, in the absence of express language to the contrary, shall be considered as having been appropriated directly to FP&C and shall be administered by FP&C under Cooperative Endeavor Agreements;

IT IS HEREBY AGREED by the State and the Entity that:

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

2.1 The purpose of this Agreement is to set forth the terms of administering the Project by FP&C. FP&C will administer this Project in accordance with the Non-State Entity Capital Outlay Administrative Guidelines. January. 2019 ed. (the "Guidelines"), which is incorporated herein and made a part of this Agreement. As required by Section 147(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The Entity hereby understands and agrees that, in addition to requirements of the Guidelines, no proceeds of the Project Bonds can or will be used for airplanes. Skyboxes or huxury private boxes, health club facilities primarily used for gambling, or any store the principal business of which is the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption off premises.

ARTICLE III SCOPE

As provided in the Act, the State funds for this Project are limited to capital improvements for the Project, in the Parish, and in the amounts set forth in the Funding Summary.

3.2 If the Entity enters into a contract prior to receipt of funding and prior to execution of a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement, then payments under such contracts are prohibited from capital outlay appropriations and are the sole responsibility of the Entity.

3.4 Allowable costs shall not include the operating expenses of the Entity. In no case shall the total of any of the allowable costs exceed the amount shown in the Funding Summary.

ARTICLE IV USE OF FUNDS

4.1 The Entity hereby acknowledges and agrees that the funds provided by the State to the Entity shall be used solely for the purposes authorized and permitted in the Act and in accordance with all provisions of law affecting the Project, as well as the constitutional and statutory restrictions on the use of State funds for public purposes. The Entity acknowledges that any funds not used in accordance with the terms of this Agreement and state law will be reimbursed to the State. **4.2** The Entity shall not execute any contracts or agreements that would expend or commit State funds in excess of the amount for which lines of credit were granted pursuant to the Act. The Entity shall be solely responsible for any amount that exceeds the amount appropriated by the State.

4.3 If the Project is authorized to be funded through the issuance of Project Bonds, the Entity shall not take any action which would have the effect of impairing the tax exempt status of the Project Bonds. The Entity agrees that the proceeds will not be used directly or indirectly in any trade or business carried on by any person other than a governmental unit. The Entity further agrees that the proceeds will not be used directly or indirectly to any trade or business carried on by any person other than a facility used by any person other than the Entity pursuant to a lease, management contract, requirements contract or other arrangement granting, directly or indirectly, an interest in or special legal entitlement to the Project to a person other than the Entity unless the State receives an opinion from a nationally recognized bond counset that such contract will not adversely affect the tax-exempt status of the Project Bonds. The Entity the State prior to entering into any such contract.

4.4 The Entity shall make no changes in its local laws, bylaws, charter or other organizational documents which would allow use of the Project for any purpose other than a public purpose.

COSTS ARTICLE V ADMINISTRATIVE

5.1 Notwithstanding any provision of this contract to the contrary. FP&C may use up to six percent of each State fund line item contained in the Funding Summary for costs associated with administering the Project, all in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

ARTICLE VI PUBLIC BID LAWS

6.1 The Entity will solicit bids for the services, labor and materials needed to construct said Project in accordance with the public bid laws of the State, including, but not limited to R.S. 38:2211, \underline{et} \underline{seq} , applicable to political subdivisions of the State. The Entity will also keep a procurement file relative to the necessary acquisition of services, labor and materials needed to complete said Project which will be subject to review by the State at any time.

ARTICLE VII COORDINATION

7.1 It is the responsibility of the Entity to administer the Project according to all applicable laws, rules and regulations and to ensure that the work is the best obtainable within established trade practice. The submittal of documentation to FP&C as required by this Agreement shall be for the purpose of verifying that the funds are spent in accordance with this Agreement and the applicable legislation, providing evidence of the progress of the Project and verifying that such documentation is being produced. FP&C will not provide extensive document for the Project or take the responsibility for determining whether or not this documentation is complete and accurate.

7.2 The participation by FP&C in the Project shall in no way be construed to make FP&C a party to any contract between the Entity and its contractors.

ARTICLE VIII CHANGE ORDERS

8.1 A change order for the Project shall be subject to the approval of FP&C. However, as per R.S. 39:126, one or more change orders that cause an excess in the aggregate of *One Hundred Thousand Dollars* (5100,000) per month

9.3 The Entity further agrees and obligates itself, its successors and assigns, to indemnify and hold harmless the State for any monetary consequences resulting any Project Bonds issued by the State or interest therein being declared taxable as a result of the Entity's actions or inactions hereunder.

DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS

10.1 After execution of this Agreement in accordance with the terms hereof and the Act, the State, through FP&CC, shall provide the Entity, identified under the Federal Tax Identification Number as set forth in the Funding Summary, with funds on an *as-needed* basis as approved by FP&CC, but not to exceed the total Capital Outlay Cash, less FP&C Administration fee, as set forth in the Funding Summary. The Entity shall not be entitled to reimbursement of any expenditures made prior to the issuance of a cash line of credit or receipt of cash funding.

10.2 If the Project is authorized to be funded through the issuance of Project Bonds, the Entity agrees to use its best efforts to expend all of the funds subject to this Agreement within two (2) years from the date of the issuance of the Project Bonds. FP&C agrees that it will notify the Entity of the date the Project Bonds are issued within one (1) nonth from the issuance thereof. The Entity understands and agrees that if the funds subject to this Agreement are nonth from the issuance thereof. The Entity understands and agrees that if the funds subject to this Agreement are not totally expended within two (2) years from the issuance of the Project Bonds, FP&C can close the Project and recommend that the Legislature reallocate any unexpended proceeds to other projects.

10.3 The Entity recognizes and agrees that the receipt of the State monies is contingent upon the receipt, pledge and expenditure of Local/Federal Matching Funds by the Entity in the amount stated in the Funding Summary. The Entity acknowledges and agrees that the requisite amount of matching funds has been received, pledged, and/or expended on the Project.

10.4 In the event funds subject to this Agreement represent a non-cash line of credit as set forth in the Funding Summary, the Entity understands that the funds so designated represent a non-cash line of credit and that no monies can be withdrawn from the Treasury for the non-cash line of credit unless and until the State Bond Commission has either issued bonds or a cash line of credit therefor.

ARTICLE XI OWNERSHIP OF PROPERTY

11.1 The Entity hereby covenants that it owns, will acquire title to, or obtain servitudes for the property upon which the Project is to be located and that it shall not, while any of the Project Bonds remain outstanding, or during the term of this Agreement, transfer, convey, sell, lease, mortgage, assign or otherwise alienate its ownership or servitude rights in the land or real property and appurtenances which constitute the Project except as provided in Section 4.3. Projects to be located by permits on existing property of the State or a political subdivision of the State are exempt from these ownership requirements.

11.2 The Entity shall not sell, transfer, or otherwise dispose of any of the facilities financed with the Project Bond proceeds prior to the end of the Term, except such minor parts or portions thereof as may be disposed of due to normal wear and obsolescence.

ARTICLE XIV TERM

14.1 The provisions of this Agreement shall be effective from the date of execution hereof and shall be binding upon all parties and shall remain in effect until FP&C determines that the project(s) for which funds are appropriated is completed or for as long as any Project Bonds issued for the Project, or any retinding bonds therefor, remain outstanding.

ARTICLE XV TERMINATION

FP&C may reminate this Agreement for cause based upon the failure of Entity to totally spend all funds subject to this Agreement within two years from the execution of this Agreement or, if applicable, within two years from the issuance of any Project Bonds or for any act by the Entity that the State determines to be unlawful or in from the issuance of any Project Bonds or for any act by the Entity that the State determines to be unlawful or in violation of this Agreement.

15.2 FP&C may terminate this Agreement at any time without penalty by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the Entity of such termination. Entity shall be entitled to payment for deliverables in progress to the extent work has been approved by FP&C and subject to the availability of funds.

ARTICLE XVI AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS

16.1 The availability of funds set forth in the Funding Summary are subject to and contingent upon appropriation of funds by the legislature and, if applicable, issuance of a line of credit by the State Bond Commission.

ARTICLE XVII ASSIGNMENT

17.1 Entity shall not assign any interest in this contract and shall not transfer any interest in same (whether by assignment or novation), without prior written consent of the FP&C.

ARTICLE XVIII AUDIT

18.1 As provided in the Act, the Entity agrees to comply with the provisions of R.S. 24:513. The Act provides that no funds shall be released or provided to the Entity if, when and for as long as the Entity fails or refuses to comply with R.S. 24:513.

18.2 The Entity shall maintain appropriate financial records, and the State reserves the right to audit these records or require the Entity to provide an audit at any time. The Entity agrees to retain all books, records, and other

COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT

BY AND BETWEEN

This agreement is by and between the following parties is effective from the date of signing by the last party to sign this agreement: THE TERREBONNE LEVEE AND CONSERVATION DISTRICT ("TLCD"), a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, whose current address is 220-A Clendenning Road, Houma, Louisiana 70363, represented by Executive Director, Reggie Dupre, Jr.; and **THE PARISH OF TERREBONNE**, ("PARISH"), a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, whose current address is P. O. Box 2768, Houma, Louisiana 70361, represented herein by Jason Bergeron, Parish President.

WHEREAS, the TLCD has the authority of a local political subdivision to enter into agreements with each other for the public welfare, health, safety and good order of jurisdiction by virtue of the specific authority granted in LA R.S. 38:291(U); and

WHEREAS, the TLCD and PARISH each have the authority to provide for flood protection and drainage for the citizens of Terrebonne and Lafourche Parishes, respectively; and WHEREAS, both PARISH and TLCD are authorized, under Article VII, Section 14(C) of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana, to engage in cooperative endeavors "for a public purpose"; and WHEREAS, PARISH has a reasonable expectation of receiving a benefit or value that is at least equivalent to or greater than the consideration described in this Agreement; and WHEREAS, the transfer or expenditure of public funds or property is not a gratuitous donation; and WHEREAS, the communities of Point Aux Chenes, Grand Bois, Larose, Montegut and Lockport are significantly threatened by storm surge and hurricane flooding on a regular basis; and WHEREAS, Reach K of Morganza to the Gulf Hurricane Protection System (MTG) provides critical flood protection to these communities; and

but not limited to dirt material provided through a dirt material publicly bid contract, towards improving the Reach K Levee to +11.0' NAVD88; and WHEREAS, analysis by engineers has estimated it will cost approximately \$1,008,000 in additional funding to improve to +11.0' NAVD88 the portion of the Reach K Levee between the two water control structures along Grand Bayou; and **WHEREAS**, TLCD needs assistance with its project to rehabilitate and improve Reach K of MTG to +11.0' NAVD88 in order to provide increased flood protection to Point Aux Chenes, Grand Bois, Larose, Montegut and Lockport; and

WHEREAS, TLCD has requested PARISH, along with other local agencies tasked with a duty to provide flood protection to its citizens, to provide a proportional share of the \$1,008,000 in funding estimated to improve to $+11.0^{\circ}$ NAVD88 the portion of the Reach K Levee between the two water control structures along Grand Bayou; and WHEREAS, Reach K of MTG is an integrated coastal protection project eligible for funding under Section 105 the Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act (GOMESA) Act of 2006 (Title I of Division C of Public Law 109-432; 43 U.S.C. 1331 *et seq.*; 120 Stat. 3000), 30 C.F.R. Parts 219 and 1219, Louisiana Constitution Article VII, Sections 9(B), 10.1 and 10.2, and La. R.S. 49:214.5.4(E); and WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into this Agreement for the purpose of reducing the overall threat of storm surge as a result of hurricane, tropical storms, or other natural phenomenon and to reduce the harm to citizens and damages to property located in their respective jurisdictions; NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of all of the parties' mutual undertakings herein and their purposes, duties and authorities under the laws and Constitution of the State of Louisiana, the parties do hereby agree as follows regarding the Project:

I. SCOPE OF WORK

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE PARISH PRESIDENT OR ADMINISTRATION TO ENTER INTO A COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR WITH THE STATE OF LOUISIANA, OFFICE OF LANDS, AND EXECUTE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS FOR THE USE OF CERTAIN WATER BOTTOMS.

SECTION I

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, in Article VII, Section 14(C), provides that the State and its political subdivisions may engage in cooperative endeavors with each other and with any public or private association, corporation or individual for a public purpose; and

WHEREAS, the State is the owner of Bayou Terrebonne, located in Section 39, T17S-R17E, Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana, as shown on the attached plats; and

WHEREAS, by virtue of the provisions of La. R.S. 41:1701, et. seq. the State is authorized to lease water bottoms for any legitimate private, public, or commercial use; and

WHEREAS, the State desires to lease to the Parish a portion of Bayou Terrebonne for the construction, operation, and maintenance of a Bulkhead, two Timber Docks, and Kayak Launch, which will be made available to the public for recreational activities. It is understood that the public recreation will not generate public or private revenue and are solely being constructed for the recreational purpose of enhancing recreational opportunities on Bayou Terrebonne; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into an Agreement to facilitate and advance the goals recited herein, as well as other goals for the public benefit of the State; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Terrebonne Parish Council on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government that:

SECTION I

the Parish President (or Administration) is hereby authorized to execute and enter into and enforce a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement, subject to legal, with the State of Louisiana, Office of Lands, to lease to the Parish a portion of Bayou Terrebonne for the construction, operation, and maintenance of a Bulkhead, two Timber Docks, and Kayak Launch, not inconsistent with the proposed agreement attached to this Ordinance, and that the Parish President (or Administration) is hereby authorized to execute and enter into and enforce any agreements necessary and proper to effectuate the attached Cooperative Endeavor Agreement, all in accordance with the terms contained in that agreement, which is attached hereto.

SECTION II

If any word, clause, phrase, section, or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, the remaining words, clauses, phrases, sections and other portions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect, the provisions of this ordinance hereby being declared to be separable.

SECTION III

This ordinance shall become effective upon approval by the parish president or as otherwise provided in Section 2-13 (b) of the Home Rule Charter for a Consolidated Government for Terrebonne Parish, whichever occurs sooner.

COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT & WATER BOTTOM LEASE

This Cooperative Endeavor Agreement and Water Bottom Lease (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement" or "Lease") is made and entered into by and between:

The State of Louisiana, through the Division of Administration, Office of State Lands, represented herein by Cheston Hill (hereinafter referred to as the "State" or "Lessor"); and

Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, represented herein by Jason W. Bergeron, Parish President (hereinafter referred to as the "Parish" or "Lessee");

Who enter into this Agreement pertaining to certain water bottoms owned by the State for use by Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government in its provision of Public Recreation to the citizens and visitors of Terrebonne Parish, in exchange for the covenants and consideration set forth herein.

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, in Article VII, Section 14(C), provides that the State and its political subdivisions may engage in cooperative endeavors with each other and with any public or private association, corporation or individual for a public purpose.

WHEREAS, the State is the owner of Bayou Terrebonne, located in Section 39, T17S-R17E, Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana, as shown on the attached plats.

WHEREAS, by virtue of the provisions of La. R.S. 41:1701, et. seq. the State is authorized to lease water bottoms for any legitimate private, public, or commercial use.

WHEREAS, the State desires to lease to the Parish a portion of Bayou Terrebonne for the construction, operation, and maintenance of a Bulkhead, two Timber Docks, and Kayak Launch, which will be made available to the public for recreational activities. It is understood that the public recreation will not generate public or private revenue and are solely being constructed for the recreational purpose of enhancing recreational opportunities on Bayou Terrebonne.

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into an Agreement to facilitate and advance the goals recited herein, as well as other goals for the public benefit of the State.

WHEREAS, because it is anticipated that the public recreational value of the recreation structures will exceed the value of the obligations of the State, the Agreement is not a gratuitous donation.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree to the lease terms set forth below:

PROPERTY

Approximately 1,782 square feet of state claimed water bottoms in Bayou Terrebonne, located in Section 39, T17S-R17E, Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana, as shown on the plats attached hereto as Exhibit A (hereinafter referred to as the "Property").

<u>TERM</u>

The Lease is granted for a term of <u>FIVE (5) YEARS</u>, commencing on______, and ending on ______, with an option in favor of the Lessee to renew for <u>NINE (9)</u> successive five year terms. In no case shall said Lease extend beyond a fifty (50) year maximum period. Any extension of the Lease must be made in writing signed by both Lessor and Lessee.

RENTAL

The rental payment constituting the consideration of this Lease is the price and sum of $\underline{\text{Zero and } 00/100}$ (\$0.00) Dollars per annum. This Lease will become binding on Lessor only after execution by Lessor and delivery to Lessee. Deposit of Lessee's first rental payment into any account of Lessor does <u>not</u> constitute acceptance of this Lease by Lessor.

IMPROVEMENTS

Lessee shall <u>not</u> make any improvements, additions, alterations or constructions of any nature whatsoever to the Property, other than those provided for in the original plans and specifications attached hereto, without prior written permission of Lessor.

CONDITIONS

1. This Lease is granted subject to all existing surface leases, mineral leases, servitudes, rights-of-way, permits or any other contracts, whether recorded or unrecorded, affecting the Property.

2. Lessee shall comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances for sewer, sanitation, fire, safety and any other regulated activities and provide Lessor with proof of compliance.

3. Lessee agrees to use the Property as a good and careful administrator. This includes maintaining the Property in a neat, clean and orderly manner at all times. No hazardous waste materials shall be used on, placed, stored or disposed of by Lessee on or under the Property.

4. Should an Attorney be employed to give special attention to the enforcement or protection of any claim of Lessor arising from this Lease, Lessee shall pay as fees and compensation to such Attorney such sum as will constitute a reasonable fee including all court costs, together with all other costs, charges and expenses or reimbursement for actual costs occasioned by Lessor.

5. The drainage, public navigation and marine life of the surrounding area shall not be impeded in any manner.

6. Lessee acknowledges and understands that the Property is the sole property of the State of Louisiana, and that no proprietary rights or title shall vest in Lessee or be construed as transferred or abandoned by Lessor by reason of this Lease. Lessee further understands and agrees that this Lease shall not be construed to recognize or confirm title or rights with respect to riparian property relative to adverse claimants or as between riparian owners.

RESERVATIONS

Lessor reserves the full use and enjoyment of the Property, both surface and subsurface, for any and all purposes except those particular uses granted hereinabove to Lessee. Lessor's reservation includes, but is not limited to the following rights:

1. Lessor reserves all rights of whatever nature and kind in and to all minerals on or under the Property. These rights include, but are not limited to, all operations which are necessary, useful or convenient for the exploration, exploitation, drilling, mining, production, development, storage and transportation of all oil, gas, sulphur and other minerals, on or under the Property or any other lands under the control of Lessor.

2. Lessor reserves all rights of whatever nature and kind in and to all other surface or subsurface uses of the Property. These rights include, but are not limited to, all operations which are necessary, useful or convenient for the exploration, exploitation, mining, production and development of all sand, gravel or shell deposits; issuance of servitudes and rights-of-way; and issuance of permits

and leases.

3. Nothing herein contained shall be construed as to prohibit or preclude the Lessor herein from granting to other persons, associations or corporations the right to cross over or under the Property, provided that if such crossing should necessitate the alteration or relocation of the recreation structures constructed by Lessee, all costs thereof shall be at the expense of such subsequent grantee, subject to the following:

- a. The parties hereto recognize that it might hereafter become necessary or desirable to widen, deepen or make some other work of public improvement on the Property, and this Lease is accepted under the express condition and with the distinct understanding that, if any work by the United States or the State of Louisiana or any department, agency, or political subdivision of either makes it necessary to alter or relocate the floating docks, the entire costs of alteration or relocation shall be borne by the Lessee, the responsibility on the part of the Lessee being part of the consideration from which this Lease is made.
- b. Lessor may exercise the rights reserved herein without Lessee's consent, so long as those rights granted do not prohibit Lessee's use of the Property. Lessee hereby expressly agrees and declares that Lessor shall not be liable to Lessee for damages resulting from the exercise of any rights reserved herein.

ASSIGNMENT/SUBLEASE

This Agreement shall be binding upon Lessor and Lessee, their respective successors and assigns. This Lease may not be assigned, subleased or otherwise transferred in whole or in part without the prior written permission of Lessor, provided, however, that such consent shall not be necessary in the event of a transfer of the Lease resulting from a corporate merger, consolidation or change of name of Lessee.

HOLD HARMLESS

1. Lessee accepts the Property in its present condition and Lessor shall not be responsible for damage of any kind to any person or property arising out of or resulting from Lessee's use of the Property. Lessee further agrees to indemnify and to hold Lessor harmless against any loss or liability for injury to or death of persons or damage to property of others, including costs and expenses incident thereto, arising wholly or in part from or in connection with the condition, use or existence of the Property or any of the rights granted herein. Lessee will, at Lessor's request, appear and defend any suit arising from any such loss or liability at its own sole cost and expense and will pay any judgement that may be entered against Lessor therein when said suit is finally determined for such loss or liability resulting from Lessee's use of the Property.

2. Lessee further acknowledges and understands that Lessee's acceptance of the Property in its present condition and without any warranty of title whatsoever by Lessor, that Lessor will not be responsible to Lessee for any loss or damage that Lessee may suffer as a result of any claim, demand or cause of action that may be brought by third parties asserting riparian or reclamation rights to the Property leased herein.

LIABILITY INSURANCE

Lessee is required to maintain a minimum amount of liability insurance of at least Five Hundred Thousand and 00/100 (\$500,000) Dollars of liability insurance or a greater amount as established by Lessor at all times this Lease is in effect. Lessee shall ensure that the State of Louisiana is named as an additional insured and a certificate of insurance shall be submitted to Lessor upon request to insure continued coverage.

TERMINATION/EXPIRATION

1. Lessor may terminate the Lease for cause based upon the failure of the Lessee to comply with the terms and/or conditions of the Lease, including but not limited to failure to pay rent, discontinued use of the Property, or construction of unauthorized improvements that deviate substantially from those set forth in the Lessee's plans and specifications. Prior to termination, the Lessor shall give the Lessee written notice specifying the Lessee's failure. If within thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of such notice, the Lessee shall not have either corrected such failure or, in the case of failure which cannot be corrected in thirty (30) calendar days, begun in good faith to correct said

failure and thereafter proceeded diligently to complete such correction, then the Lessor may, at its option, place the Lessee in default and terminate the Lease on the date specified in such notice.

2. Should Lessee at any time use the Property or any portion thereof for any illegal or unlawful purpose, or should Lessee commit, or permit or tolerate the commission of any act made punishable by fine or imprisonment under the laws of the United States or the State of Louisiana, or any ordinance of the Parish, the Lessor may terminate the Lease immediately upon written or verbal notice to Lessee.

3. It is understood and agreed that should it be determined that the Property covered by this Lease is required for a public purpose by the State, Lessee shall be so notified by writing and this Lease shall be terminated and the Property surrendered ninety (90) days from the date of receipt of said notice. A pro-rata share of the annual rental shall be repaid to Lessee based on the ratio of the terminated period to the total annual rental period.

4. Lessee may surrender this Lease at any time, either during the original term or any extension of the original term by giving written notice to Lessor. If Lessee had previously recorded this Lease in the parish conveyance records, then Lessee shall file a written release in the parish conveyance records and shall provide Lessor a certified copy thereof. Surrender of this Lease shall not affect any existing obligations of the Lessee or relieve the Lessee of any obligations previously incurred.

5. Upon termination of this Lease, Lessee will ipso facto forfeit any right of recourse against Lessor for return of all or part of the consideration paid.

6. Upon dissolution of this Lease for any reason, including but not limited to termination for cause, expiration of the term or surrender by the Lessee, Lessee or its assigns hereby agree to remove at their sole risk, cost and expense any or all improvements, constructions, or obstacles and to restore the Property to its original condition within ninety (90) days. In the event Lessee fails to remove all constructions from the Property within ninety (90) days, then Lessor may (1) appropriate ownership of the improvements upon written notice, with no compensation owed to Lessee, or (2) remove the improvements, constructions, or obstacles. In the event Lessor must pay for removal of any improvements, constructions, or obstacles, Lessee is obligated to reimburse the Lessor for such removal expenses within thirty (30) days of demand thereof.

7. Should Lessor allow or permit Lessee to remain on the Property after the expiration or termination of this Lease, this shall not be construed as a reconduction of this Lease.

NOTICES

Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been given when (i) deposited in Federal Express (or any other national "next day" delivery service), or (ii) deposited in the United States mail via registered or certified main, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, or (iii) hand delivered, or (iv) sent via facsimile or email.
