RESOLUTION: Supporting the inclusion of all ten of the proposed GOM lease sales in the Final Outer Continental Shelf Oil and Gas Leasing Program

WHEREAS, The United States Department of the Interior has released its proposed 5-year Offshore Leasing Program after a long delay; and,

WHEREAS, the people of Terrebonne Parish are concerned that this Offshore Leasing Program appears to fall far short of what is needed to meet the energy needs of the United States; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed Offshore Leasing Program schedules no new oil and gas lease sales over the next five years during a time in which energy prices are rising, global supply chains are experiencing periodic and sometimes severe disruptions, and inflation remains at historic levels impacting every household imposing serious economic risk for millions of American families and businesses; and,

WHEREAS, Gulf of Mexico energy producers, among the lowest carbon-intensive in the world, according to the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management, supply nearly 15% of America's oil production and over 2% of the nation's natural gas; and,

WHEREAS, the specter of no future lease sales puts U.S. energy security at risk and compromises U.S. producers' ability to provide affordable, reliable energy to the American people, not to mention the significant number of jobs the energy sector supports throughout the U.S., jobs which generate billions to the economy and local, state, and federal tax revenues; and,

WHEREAS, studies have shown that oil and natural gas will play an important role in meeting U.S. energy needs for the foreseeable future but if it comes from areas of the world beyond our shores where environmental standards are considerably less stringent, the U.S. runs the risk of ceding our position as a global energy leader as we become reliant on foreign sources to supply our energy needs; and,

WHEREAS, oil leases in the Gulf of Mexico are a critical source of funding for critical coastal restoration projects along the Gulf Coast, particularly in coastal Louisiana as well as funds to improve our National Park infrastructure throughout the U.S.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE TERREBONNE PARISH COUNCIL, ON BEHALF OF TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT, HEREBY strongly urges the United States Department of the Interior in its Final Outer Continental Shelf Oil and Gas Leasing Program to include all ten (10) of the proposed lease sales in the Gulf of Mexico as well as the proposed sale for the Cook Inlet in Alaska so that the United States continue its energy leadership, support

good-paying jobs and meet domestic energy demand with resources produced in the United States.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE 2022 ADOPTED OPERATING BUDGET, 5-YEAR CAPITAL OUTLAY BUDGET AND BUDGETED POSITIONS OF THE TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT FOR THE FOLLOWING ITEMS AND TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS.

SECTION I

WHEREAS, Administration is requesting additional funding of \$281,686 for the Hollywood Road Extension Bridge, and

WHEREAS, the funding source is from the Sales Tax Revenue Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, that the 2022 Adopted Operating Budget and 5-Year Capital Outlay Budget be amended for the Hollywood Road Extension Bridge. (Attachment A)

SECTION II

WHEREAS, Administration is requesting additional funding of \$56,441 for the soccer field expansions at the Parish Sports Park Complex, and

WHEREAS, the funding source is from the Sales Tax Revenue Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, that the 2022 Adopted Operating Budget and 5-Year Capital Outlay Budget be amended for the Parish Sports Park Complex. (Attachment B)

SECTION III

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government has received funding allocated by the state for improvements to the HVAC systems for low to moderate income publicly owned community facilities from the Office of Community Development (OCD), and

WHEREAS, it has been reported that the Schriever, Gibson, and Church Street Head Start facilities are in dire need of new/upgraded HVAC systems, and

WHEREAS, each of these items can be obtained through the Parish on behalf of these facilities utilizing CARES act funding from OCD.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, that the 2022 Adopted Operating Budget be amended for the Head Start HVAC Program. (Attachment C)

SECTION IV

WHEREAS, the Houma Police Department is creating a School Resource Officer (SRO) division to meet the common goals of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, Terrebonne Parish School District and Houma-Terrebonne Diocese of providing a safe learning environment for students, a safe working environment for educational staff, the prevention and reduction of juvenile dependency; and

WHEREAS, this division will provide resources for the purposes of maintaining a safe and secure learning environment for students, providing a safe working environment for educational staff, preventing, and reducing school-related violence and offenses committed by juveniles or adults, and promoting positive attitudes regarding the role of law enforcement in society; and

WHEREAS, all parties will enter into a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement which will define the scope, the duties and responsibilities and terms of all parties; and

WHEREAS, the creation of the SRO Division has a cost of \$306,344 for 2022, and

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish School District and Houma-Terrebonne Diocese will reimburse the division \$188,174 in 2022 and \$118,170 is coming from the Public Safety fund balance.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, that the 2022 Adopted Operating Budget and Budgeted Positions be amended to reflect new School Resource Officer Division within Houma Police Department. (Attachment D)

SECTION V

WHEREAS, Administration is requesting to amend the Budgeted Positions, adding a full time Planner I, Grade 207 and deleting a full time Planner II, Grade 209 for the Planning Department, and

WHEREAS, the budgeted dollars for the change is (\$8,433).

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, that the 2022 Budgeted Positions be amended to recognize the necessary change for the Planning Department. (Attachment E)

SECTION VI

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, hereby authorizes Gordon Dove, Parish President, to execute any and all documents for these amendments as approved by the legal department.

SECTION VII

If any work, clause, phrase, section, or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, the remaining words, clauses, phrases, sections, and other portions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect, the provisions of this ordinance hereby being declared to be severable.

SECTION VIII

This Ordinance shall become effective upon approval by the Parish President or as otherwise provided in Section 2-13(b) of the Home Rule Charter for a Consolidated Government for Terrebonne Parish, whichever occurs sooner.

We walked three Head Start facilities on Wednesday, October 13, 2021. The following observations are noted with recommendations for the air-conditioning systems.

Schriever 1 & 2 Head Start 162 Hwy. 311 Schriever, LA

The facility air conditioning is made up of multiple direct expansion refrigerant systems. The majority of the building is conditioned in the four (4) main classrooms, each by a 3 ton wall hung unit manufactured by Marvair. This units were made to utilize R-22 refrigerant that is no longer supported and is no longer available. The Marvair transfers heat and moisture to precondition the incoming outside air but doesn't completely condition sufficiently, to remove humidity from the incoming air. Due to the age of the energy recovery heat wheels, they no longer operate correctly. Heating backup is by a 9 KW electric heat coils in each unit. The units utilize hot gas reheat on the outside air to try and prevent overcooling of the spaces. The wall hung units supply air is ducted into the classroom and is returned by a grille connected to the unit. These units appear to be original to the building.

There are two (2) Package Terminal Air Conditioning (PTAC) units that each condition an office space. These units are one step up from a window unit except that they are permanently installed in the exterior wall and only a grille is seen from the exterior. These units were originally installed in the building. These units are on the low end of efficiency and probably do not meet energy code or refrigerant mandates.

There is a residential split Dx unit that has been installed to condition the hall and restrooms. It is assumed that the system was installed due to the originally installed systems not being able to meet the building air conditioning load.

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There is a residential split Dx unit that has been installed to condition the hall and restrooms. It is assumed that the system was installed due to the originally installed systems not being able to meet the building air conditioning load.

Outside air requirements are not being met at the facility for occupancy loads. There are no dedicated systems to precondition outside air for the building. The only systems providing outside air are the four (4) Marvair units. They only cycle the outside air when in conditioning mode to prevent humidity levels from exceeding American Society of Heating and Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) Standards. Without proper pressurization of the building, the building will go into a negative pressure condition where hot wet air will be pulled into the building and could cause mold and mildew issues. There is insufficient capacity of air-conditioning at the facility to properly condition the amount of outside air required for the building.

The equipment does not meet outside air requirements, has obsolete refrigerant, does not meet current codes, and the equipment has degraded performance. It is recommended to change the equipment to systems that will provide correct performance, capacity and meet current codes.

The building is conditioned by two wall pack units like the Marvair units at the Schriever facility. These wall pack units do not meet outside air requirements for the building's occupancy load. The units are inefficient and cannot be modified to handle the air-conditioning load of the building under varying conditions and maintain proper humidity levels. The wall pack units directly blow air into the main classroom on each end of the building. There is no ductwork to properly distribute air into the center rooms -- the center rooms are not properly conditioned.

The equipment does not meet outside air requirements, has obsolete refrigerant, does not meet current codes, and the equipment has degraded performance. It is recommended to change the equipment to systems that will provide correct performance, capacity and meet current codes.

Church Street 1 & 2 Head Start
1116 Church Street
Houma, LA 70360

The facility consists of two buildings. The main building is a slab on grade and the adjacent building is a raised, modular building.

The main building is conditioned by gas fired rooftop package units. Due to fire hazards and the possibility of carbon monoxide poisoning it is recommended to heat the building with a safer non-flammable source. The rooftop package unit uses Dx cooling to condition the building. The issue that occurs with rooftop package systems is the possibility of a roof leak. It is recommended to have as few roof penetrations as possible to minimize roof leaks, but a rooftop package is an extremely large roof penetration that when leaks can cause an extreme amount of damage in the building. There is no dedicated outside air system for the building to meet outside air requirements. The rooftop air unit is not capable of providing the amount of outside air needed in the main building.

The modular classroom building is conditioned by a residential split Dx unit that has been installed in the building at the location of the old wall pack unit. A closet was constructed in front of the wall pack unit and the split Dx air unit was installed in the closet. This residential AC system is not made to condition the space and provide outside air to meet occupancy loads.

It is recommended to remove the rooftop unit and patch the roof to prevent possible water damage and to provide an air unit system that will meet current codes and standards. The new system should provide safe operation without the possibility of carbon monoxide poisoning. A dedicated outdoor air system should be installed to meet the requirements of the occupancy.

All systems should be integrated into the dedicated outside air to prevent the outside air from running during normal unoccupied periods to minimize operation costs. The current systems can not meet codes to maintain good indoor air quality and have to be changed to provide proper conditioning of the spaces. It is recommended to change all of the building's air-conditioning systems so that they meet current codes, performance, and indoor air quality requirements. Electrical will be modified to meet the requirements of the new mechanical systems.

Our opinion of probable costs for the mechanical and electrical modifications are as follows:

- Schriever 1& 2 Head Start - \$ 159,000
- Gibson Head Start - \$ 116,000
- Church Street 1 & 2 Head Start - \$ 186,000
- Total Mechanical and Electrical: \$ 461,000

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE 2022 ADOPTED OPERATING BUDGET, 5-YEAR CAPITAL OUTLAY BUDGET AND BUDGETED POSITIONS OF THE TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT FOR THE FOLLOWING ITEMS AND TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS.

I. Houma Police Dept-SRO Division, \$118,170

SECTION I

WHEREAS, the Houma Police Department is creating a School Resource Officer (SRO) division to meet the common goals of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, Terrebonne Parish School District and Houma-Terrebonne Diocese of providing a safe learning environment for students, a safe working environment for educational staff, the prevention and reduction of juvenile dependency; and

WHEREAS, this division will provide resources for the purposes of maintaining a safe and secure learning environment for students, providing a safe working environment for educational staff, preventing and reducing school-related violence and offenses committed by juveniles or adults, and promoting positive attitudes regarding the role of law enforcement in society; and

WHEREAS, all parties will enter into a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement which will define the scope, the duties and responsibilities and terms of all parties; and

WHEREAS, the creation of the SRO Division has a cost of \$306,344 for 2022, and

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish School District and Houma-Terrebonne Diocese will reimburse the division \$188,174 in 2022 and \$118,170 is coming from the Public Safety fund balance.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 4-4 OF THE TERREBONNE PARISH CODE TO ALLOW PERMITTED ORGANIZATIONS TO SELL ALCOHOL AT PERMITTED EVENTS

WHEREAS, Section 2-11 of the Terrebonne Parish Home Rule Charter requires an ordinance to amend or repeal previous Ordinances; adopt or amend an administrative code; and establish a rule or regulation imposing fines or other penalties; and

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Council would like to promote recreation within the parish, and

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Council's goal is to protect the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens, and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Terrebonne Parish Council on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government that:

SECTION I

Section 4-4 of the Terrebonne Parish Code shall be amended (using strikethrough to indicate deletions and underlining to indicate additions) and same are hereby adopted to read as follows:

Sec. 4-4. – Location restrictions.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell at retail for on-premises consumption any alcoholic beverage within three hundred (300) feet of the property lines of any library, school, playground, or church.

(d) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein or in Section 21-30, any person desiring to sell alcoholic beverages for an event in any of the properties listed in subsection (a) may obtain an exemption event permit from TPCG Administration Department based upon an application, setting forth the purpose of the event, the time of the event, the sponsor of the event, and any other information deemed necessary by TPCG Administration Department and comply with the requirements of the permit, including a Hold Harmless agreement and Insurance requirements. AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 21-30 OF THE TERREBONNE PARISH CODE TO ALLOW PERMITTED ORGANIZATIONS TO SELL ALCOHOL AT PERMITTED EVENTS

WHEREAS, Section 2-11 of the Terrebonne Parish Home Rule Charter requires an ordinance to amend or repeal previous Ordinances; adopt or amend an administrative code; and establish a rule or regulation imposing fines or other penalties; and

No fee shall be charged by the parish government for this permit. Notwithstanding this waiver of a permit fee, all other parish rules, regulations, ordinances and procedures must be followed in obtaining the permit as utilizing the park/playground or any facilities located in the park/playground.~~

(c) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein or in Section 4-4, any person desiring to sell alcoholic beverages for an event in any of the parks and playgrounds listed in subsection (a) may obtain an exemption event permit from TPCG Administration Department based upon an application, setting forth the purpose of the event, the time of the event, the sponsor of the event, and any other information deemed necessary by TPCG Administration Department and comply with the requirements of the permit, including a Hold Harmless agreement and Insurance requirements. ARTICLE III. LITTERING

Sec. 14-46. Littering prohibited.

- (a) No person shall dump, throw, or deposit any litter, refuse, trash, tin cans, bottles, garbage, leaves, or any other debris, putrescible or nonputrescible, upon his/her property, property belonging to any other person, or upon or in any public or private roads, on the right-of-way of any public or private highway, public roads, rights-of-way, ditches, drainage channels, surface or subsurface drainage artery, and branches, rivers or waterways, of any kind whatsoever, including, but not limited to, the levees and drainage ways of the Terrebonne Parish drainage system or of any drainage district. The ordinances of this article shall not include properly maintained composting containers.
- (b) (1) Any item including, but not limited to, mail addressed to a specific person or material containing a name and address which is found in the trash, garbage, refuse, or debris thrown or dumped or deposited as stated in subsection (a) above, shall be a prima facie presumption under this section that the violator thereof is the person or persons identified thereby and traceable thereto and same is admissible in evidence for that purpose; provided, however, that should such person or persons produce proper evidence or testimony that he, she or they have a contract with or can produce receipt from a commercial or other hauler indicating that payment was made thereto to haul the garbage, trash, refuse or litter, then the prima facie presumption herein established shall shift to said commercial or other hauler.
- (2) If the litter is disposed from a motor vehicle, boat, or conveyance, except a bus or large passenger vehicle or a school bus, all as defined in R.S. 32:1, there shall be an inference that the driver of the conveyance disposed of the litter. If such litter was possessed by a specific person immediately before the act of disposing, there shall be an inference that the possessor committed the act of disposing.
- (3) a. The proprietary party or benefiting party of any sign, notice or structure including, but not limited to, political campaign signs posted, erected or displayed on property owned by Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government or within public rights-of-way shall be presumed to be the violator of this provision, however, should such proprietary party or benefiting party produce proper evidence or testimony that he has a contract with or can produce receipt from a third party employed to post, erect or display such signs which contract of receipt contains an express provision forbidding installation on the property of Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government or on public rights-of-way, then the prima facie presumption herein established shall shift to said third party. All signs, notices or structures which constitute litter in accordance with this chapter shall be removed by parish officials and placed in storage.
- b. In the case of a nuisance warning for a sign, notice or structure which constitutes litter in accordance with this chapter, the warning notice shall state that the sign, notice or structure may be retrieved from the department within thirty (30) days of the date of service of the nuisance warning. In the case of nuisance citations issued for any sign, notice or structure which constitutes litter in accordance with this chapter, the citation, in addition to assessing a penalty and any fees and costs as set out in article XI of this chapter, shall contain information advising the violator that he may retrieve the sign upon payment of the penalty or by ruling of the nuisance abatement panel. In no case shall the department be obligated to store the litter beyond the thirty (30) days allowed for payment of penalties.
- (c) Violations to the ordinances of this chapter may be remedied in the manner specified in article XI of this chapter, or by the issuance of a summons by a law enforcement officer acting with adequate probable cause.
