A RESOLUTION TO APPOINT AND EMPLOY AS SPECIAL LEGAL COUNSEL CHARLES C. BOURQUE, C. BERWICK DUVAL, II AND HUNT DOWNER TO REPRESENT THE TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT AS CLAIMANT AGAINST OPIOID MANUFACTURERS AND DISTRIBUTORS FOR THEIR ROLES IN THE OPIOID EPIDEMIC, AND TO AUTHORIZE THE PARISH PRESIDENT TO ENTER INTO AND EXECUTE, ON BEHALF OF THE TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT, THE NECESSARY LEGAL SERVICES CONTRACT(S) TO OBTAIN SAID SPECIAL LEGAL COUNSEL, AND TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS.

WHEREAS, Sections 2-111 and 4-03 of the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances authorizes the employment of special legal counsel by written contract and upon approval of the Terrebonne Parish Council, and

WHEREAS, the National Institute on Drug Abuse estimates that 75% of people who enter treatment for a heroin addiction took their first opioid legally from a prescription, and

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates that each day, 91 Americans die from overdosing on opioids,² and

WHEREAS, it has been reported by other municipalities that the opioid epidemic has devastated county and municipal budgets by significantly increasing the cost for law enforcement, first responders, drug treatment, lost productivity of government workers and services like autopsies, and

WHEREAS, in response, over 100 lawsuits have been filed against manufacturers such as Endo, Johnson & Johnson's Janssen unit, Teva Pharmaceutical and Allergan, all opioid prescription drug makers, for their roles in the opioid epidemic,³ and

WHEREAS, Charles C. Bourque, C. Berwick Duval, II and Hunt Downer have made the presentation and proposal to represent the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government as a claimant against opioid manufacturers and distributors in claims similar to litigation already pending against these manufacturers and distributors by other governmental entities across the United States, and

LEGAL SERVICES CONTRACT

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, TERREBONNE PARISH COSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT, through its duly authorized representatives ("CLIENT"), wishes to determine the feasibility of CLIENT bringing an action against the manufacturers, distributors, providers and/or others that provide opiates to the public (hereinafter referred to collectively as "MANUFACTURERS"), for damages to the CLIENT arising out of aggressive marketing and distribution of opiates; and

WHEREAS, the CLIENT understands based upon the pendency of similar litigation pending in the United States that the CLIENT may have various viable causes of action under state and/or federal law against such MANUFACTURERS; and

WHEREAS, the CLIENT wishes to retain special legal counsel to investigate and if appropriate commence litigation against such MANUFACTURERS, with all work to be performed on a contingency fee basis and without the CLIENT advancing costs and expenses for such litigation; and

WHEREAS, the CLIENT has decided that it wishes to engage ST MARTIN & BOURQUE; DUVAL, FUNDERBURK, SUNDBERY, RICHARD & WATKINS; and WAITZ & DOWNER ("ATTORNEYS") to investigate the viability of and if appropriate prosecute an action against such MANUFACTURERS;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants, promises, and consent herein contained, the parties agree as follows; and

ATTORNEYS, for the consideration herein provided, agrees to represent the
 CLIENT in connection with investigating and if appropriate bringing an action against
 MANUFACTURERS of prescription opiates. At a minimum, ATTORNEYS shall provide the

following services: work with CLIENT's personnel to determine the costs that the CLIENT has incurred as a result of the over-prescription of opioids; determine the viable causes of action available to the CLIENT; and determine the identity of which, if any, MANUFACTURERS that should be targeted in a lawsuit. After such identification, ATTORNEYS will, on behalf of the CLIENT, bring a lawsuit against those parties identified by ATTORNEYS, provided CLIENT'S Parish President approves those party defendants, in writing, prior to the filing of any lawsuit.

2. This Agreement shall cover the period from this date until the termination of the litigation or termination of the legal services rendered hereunder, whichever is sooner. CLIENT and ATTORNEYS hereby covenant and agree that if, during the course of investigating, preparing, handling or prosecuting this claim, ATTORNEYS make a good faith determination that further action is untenable for a successful conclusion not likely, or for any other reason as permitted by the Louisiana rules of professional conduct, ATTORNEYS shall have the right to withdraw from the case by returning to CLIENT all file materials, without claim or charge for any expenses incurred or services rendered, along with a letter of explanation of the reason for withdrawal. This Agreement may be terminated by the CLIENT by giving notice, and in the event of such termination, neither party shall have any further rights against the other, except that in the event of a recovery by the CLIENT against the defendants subsequent to termination, ATTORNEYS shall have a claim and lien for expenses of litigation incurred as of the date of termination and unpaid attorneys' fees, based on the percentage of work in progress completed on the case or claim at the time ATTORNEYS are terminated. In the event of termination of this Agreement for any reason, ATTORNEYS shall immediately return to the CLIENT all materials and documents of every kind and nature, including but not limited to the CLIENT's documents, data, information and computer disks, relating to this Agreement and the abovementioned matter.

- 3. a. There is no fee for this representation unless a monetary recovery acceptable to the CLIENT is obtained by ATTORNEYS in favor of the CLIENT, whether by suit, settlement, or otherwise. ATTORNEYS agree to advance all costs associated with prosecuting the litigation. Subject to paragraph 3 (b), below, and in consideration of the legal services to be rendered by ATTORNEYS, the CLIENT agrees that in the event that ATTORNEYS are able to obtain a monetary recovery, the contingent attorneys' fees for this representation shall be as follows:
 - i. 20% of pre-complaint recovery;
 - ii. 25% after filing of complaint;
 - iii. 33.33% of recovery after commencement of trial.

Upon the application of the applicable fee percentage to the gross amount recovered, and that dollar amount set aside as attorneys' fees to ATTORNEYS, the amount remaining shall first be reduced by the costs and disbursements that have been advanced by ATTORNEYS, and that amount shall be remitted to Attorney. By way of example only, if the litigation is settled after rulings on motions to dismiss (section 3 (a) (ii), above) for the gross amount of \$1,000,000.00, and the approved costs and disbursements are \$100,000.00, then the fee to ATTORNEYS shall be \$250,000, the costs amount of \$100,000 shall be deducted from the balance, and the net recovery to the CLIENT shall be \$650,000. The costs and disbursements which may be deducted from a monetary recovery acceptable to the CLIENT that is obtained by ATTORNEYS include and not limited to the following, without limitation: court fees, process server fees, transcripts fees, expert witness fees, courier service fees, appellate printing fees, necessary travel expenses of attorneys to attend depositions, interview witnesses and the like, and other appropriate out-of-pocket expenses, as determined in the reasonable discretion of the CLIENT. In the event that

any settlement, final judgment, or other resolution of the action results in a monetary recovery to the CLIENT that is less than the amount of the costs incurred and/or disbursements made by ATTORNEYS, the CLIENT shall not be required to pay ATTORNEYS any more than the sum of the full monetary recovery.

- b. No monies shall be paid to ATTORNEYS for any work performed, costs incurred, or disbursements made by ATTORNEYS in the event no monetary recovery to the CLIENT has been obtained by ATTORNEYS. In the event of a loss at trial due to an adverse jury verdict or a dismissal of the lawsuit by the court, no monies shall be paid to the ATTORNEYS for any work performed, costs incurred, or disbursements made by the ATTORNEYS. In such an event, neither party shall have any further rights against the other.
- 4. The responsible attorneys authorized to perform work under this contract for each firm are Charles Bourque, Berwick Duval and Hunt Downer. ATTORNEYS may, at their own expense, and from the contingent fee interest stated herein, use or associate other attorneys in the representation of the aforesaid claims of CLIENT. CLIENT understands that any one or more of those attorneys with the ATTORNEYS, may work on CLIENT's case. CLIENT further understands that in such an instance, the ATTORNEYS will share any fees that may be generated in this matter and the CLIENT will be advised of the fee division prior to any final distribution, as required.
- 5. It is expressly agreed that ATTORNEYS status hereunder is that of an independent contractor and the ATTORNEYS shall not be considered an employee of the CLIENT for any purpose.
- 6. ATTORNEYS shall not have the power to enter into any agreement binding the CLIENT or otherwise obligating the CLIENT without the prior written approval of the CLIENT.
 - 7. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws

of the State of Louisiana, without regard to conflicts of law rules. Venue shall be designated in the Thirty-Second Judicial District Court, in and for the Parish of Terrebonne, State of Louisiana. It is expressly agreed that this Agreement represents the entire agreement of the parties, that all previous understandings are merged in this Agreement, and that no modification of this Agreement shall be valid unless written and executed by both parties.

8. It is expressly agreed that if any term or provision of this Agreement, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, shall be held invalid or unenforceable to any extent, the remainder of this Agreement, or the application of such term or provision to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby; and every other term and provision of this Agreement shall be valid and shall be enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.

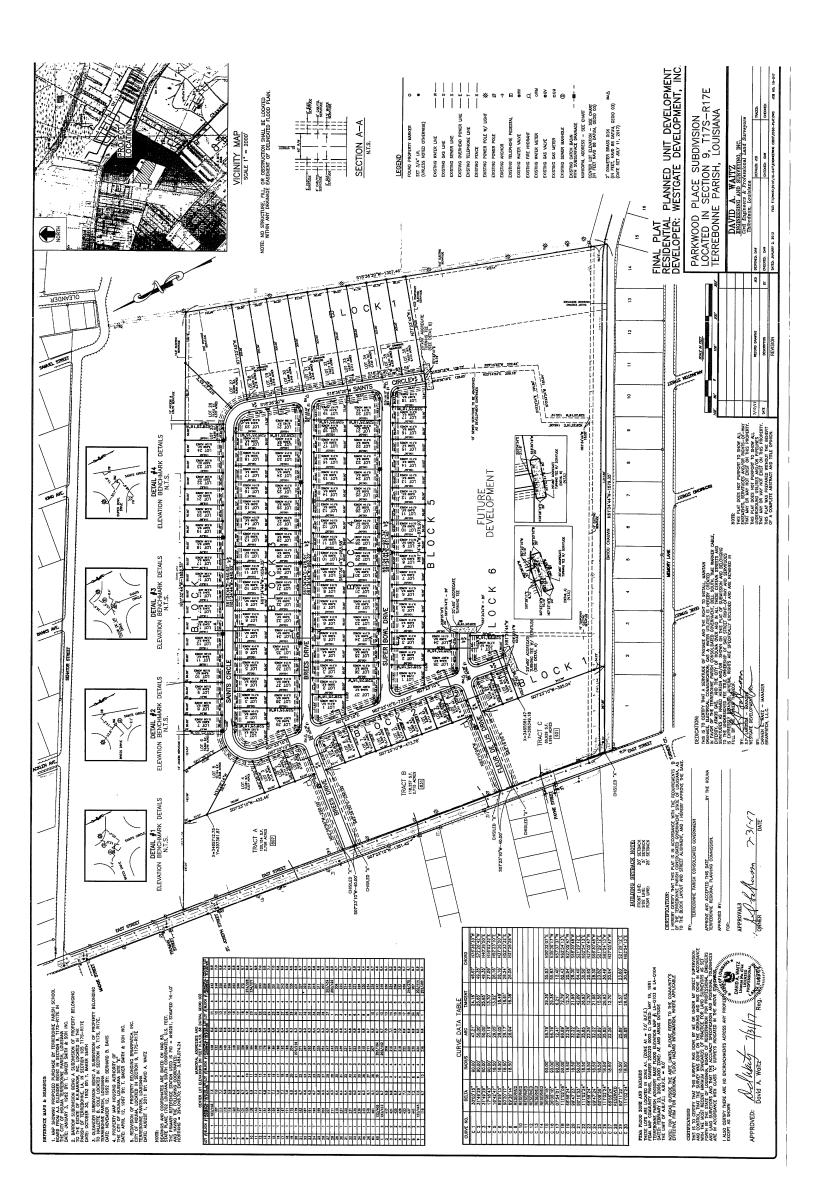

6. REMARKS:

January 2018

Lower Ward 7 Mitigation - Aptim has submitted the Change Order for the additional work proposed. Work can proceed this month after approval. **Phase I -** Project is closed out.

Phase II - Aptim has given a punch list of items with directive to the Contractor as of December 1, 2017. One item, silt fencing removal, has been started since this date.

Phase III - Aptim has received a proposal from Eustis Engineering to investigate the high organic content of the material in and under the levee. Eustis is scheduled to perform their investigation at the beginning of January.

December 2017

Lower Ward 7 Mitigation - Aptim has received a proposal from the Contractor with a specific dollar amount for the additional hydraulic dredging. Aptim will be submitting a change order to TPCG shortly.

Phase I - Project is closed out.

Phase II - Aptim has recently received a report from the Geoprobe testing. Aptim is analyzing the report's findings to give direction to the Contractor. Ceres has done repairs to property owner's driveways and boat launches as requested. The substantial completion inspection has been conducted, but due to the large amount of Punch list items, substantial completion cannot be granted.

Phase III - The slide area of the berm has been repaired. After investigation, the punch list item described as the seepage area is acutally an area of high organic content. Further investigation by Aptim is needed before a recommendation can be made to TPCG.

Lower Ward 7 Mitigation - Aptim has received approval from TPCG to initiate a request for proposal from the Contractor for additional work.

Phase I - Project is closed out.

Phase II - Eustis has visited the site and performed geoprobe testing on the slide area of the levee. Aptim is awaiting results from Eustis in order to issue a directive to Ceres for the slide repair. Aptim has received complaints from property owners regarding some of the repairs to their boat launches, drive ways, and is coordinating with Ceres to have these addressed.
