TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT, (TPCG), a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, represented herein by its duly authorized President, Gordon E. Dove (hereafter sometimes referred to as "OWNER"), and

GIS ENGINEERING, LLC, represented herein by Dustin Malbrough, duly authorized Principal (hereafter sometimes referred to as "ENGINEER"):

is a revision pursuant to 5.1.1 (Basic Services) and 5.1.2 (Additional Services) to the ENGINEERING AGREEMENT dated April 3, 2017, for professional engineering services between the OWNER and ENGINEER.

WITNESSED:

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government did enter into an original engineering contract dated April 3, 2017, to the entitled **Falgout Canal Road Repaving Project**, identified as **Parish Project No. 17-PAV-01**, and

- **WHEREAS**, the Engineering Agreement between OWNER and ENGINEER provides for certain limitations for Basic Services and specific Additional Services, and
- **WHEREAS,** the parish is desirous of restoring Falgout Canal Road back to pre-existing condition, and
- **WHEREAS,** Falgout Canal Road has experienced extensive settling and deterioration due to construction activities of the past couple of years, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Parish requested GIS to provide preliminary engineering services for the evaluation and recommendation for improvements and restoration of Falgout Canal Road, and
- **WHEREAS**, the Parish is requesting that GIS provide final design engineering services for the restoration of Falgout Canal Road, and
- WHEREAS, the TPCG is desirous of having these services continued so that there is a need for additional funds to be added to the contract for an increase in the upset limit for these services, and

AMENDMENT 1

Amend Section 5, Paragraph 5.1.1, to read as follows:

5.1.1 For Basic Services. OWNER shall pay ENGINEER for Basic Services rendered under Section 1 (as amended and supplemented by Exhibit "A", "Further Description of Basic Engineering Services and Related Matters") as follows:

Study and Report & Preliminary Design - \$104,300.00 (Lump Sum) **Basic Services - \$199,315.00**

Written authorization from OWNER must be obtain before beginning the design of any phase of work.

Amend Section 5, Paragraph 5.1.2.1, to read as follows:

5.1.2.1 General. For Additional Services and Reimbursable Expenses rendered under Paragraphs 2.1.1 through 2.1.17, inclusive (Except services covered by Paragraph 2.1.7 and services as a consultant or witness under 2.1.16), on the basis of Exhibit "D", "Current Rate Schedule - 2013". At this time the following additional services are anticipated and Estimated Costs shown below are recommended for budgetary considerations.

5.1.2.4 Resident Project Services. For resident services during construction furnished under Paragraph 2.2.1, on the basis of Exhibit "D" for services rendered by principals and employees assigned to field offices in connection with resident project representation with a Limitation of Cost of \$90,000.00

Amend Section 5, Paragraph 5.1.5, to read as follows:

5.1.3 For Reimbursable Expenses. In addition to payments provided for in Paragraphs 5.1.1 and 5.1.2, OWNER shall pay ENGINEER the actual costs of all Reimbursable Expenses incurred in connection with all Basic and Additional Services with a Limitation of Cost of \$12,800.00

GIS Engineering, LLC (GIS) is pleased to submit the following proposal for engineering services for the above referenced project to Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government (TPCG). Falgout Canal Road has experienced extensive settling and deteriation due to construction activities over the past couple of years. This proposal is for engineering services required for evaluation and recommendations for improvements and restoration of Falgout Canal Road in Terrebonne Parish due to construction related impacts. GIS is pleased to submit the following scope and cost information for the described basic engineering services and additional engineering services required for the completion of the project.

GIS completed the Study and Report Phase and is in the process of completing phases the Prelminary Design Phase for the project. As part of Amendment 1 to the contract, GIS will complete the preliminary design and the following phases described below based on the following recommendations determined in the Phase 1 Study and Report Phase.

Falgout Canal Road road was divided in to 4 segments as described below:

- Segment 1 Sta. 0+00 Sta. 50+00 (Hwy 315 to Environmental Structure 1)
- Segment 2 Sta. 50+00 Sta. 120+00 (Environment Structure 1 to Environmental Structure 2)
- Segment 3 Sta. 120+00 Sta. 210+00 (Environmental Structure 1 to Dularge Pontoon Bridge)
- Segment 4 Sta. 220+00 Sta. 259+00 (Dularge Pontoon Bridge to Hwy 57)

The recommended improvements to each segment of Falgout Canal Road are outlined below:

- Segment 1: Pavement repair and raising to 4ft.
- Segment 2: Pavement repair and raising to 4 ft.
- Segment 3: Overlay, re-slope and pavement repair
- Segment 4: Not included

Civil Engineering Basic Services:

The remaining basic services scope of work is described in this section and includes the preparation of bidding and construction documents required for the restoration and improvements of Falgout Canal Road. The remaining basic

services are detailed and discussed in this section. Additional professional services are described in the following section.

Phase 2: Preliminary Design Phase

Phase 2 will include all engineering basic services required for the completion of preliminary plans and the preliminary opinion of probable cost for the project. The services to be performed under the preliminary design phase will generally consist of the following items:

- Preparation of final design criteria.
- Design and preparation of preliminary plans.
- Preparation of outline specifications in accordance with the latest edition of the Louisiana Standard Specifications for Roads and Bridges and TPCG Standards.
- Preparation of updated opinion of probable cost estimates based on the preliminary plans.
- Assist TPCG in collating the various costs categories making up the total project costs.
- Preparation of all special specifications, specialty item descriptions, and details for the project.
- Submission of preliminary plans to TPCG for review and comments.

Phase 3: Final Design Phase

GIS shall provide all services required for the completion of final plans, specifications and cost estimates for the project. The final plan phase shall be initiated upon approval of preliminary plans by TPCG. The services to be performed under the final design phase shall generally consist of the following items:

- Incorporation of TPCG comments into the final plans.
- Preparation of final specifications and bidding documents for review by TPCG.
- Design and preparation of completed detailed final plans. The final plans are to include detailed final drawings for specialty items, layouts, utility locations, if applicable, or any other special details.
- Preparation and submittal of updated opinion of probable costs based on the final plans.
- Submittal of engineer stamped, signed final plans.

The final design phase shall include, but not limited to the following documents:

- Title Sheet and Layout Map
- General Notes Sheets
- Typical Section and Detail Sheets
- Summary of Estimated Quantities Sheets
- Tabulated Quantities Sheets
- Geometric Layout Sheets
- Final Opinion of Probable Cost
- Final Specifications and Bidding Documents

Phase 4: Bidding Phase

After authorization to proceed with the bidding phase, GIS shall assist TPCG in advertising for and obtaining bids for the project. GIS's services shall include the following:

- Assist TPCG in advertising and obtaining bids or proposals.
- Issue and track bid documents issued to prospective bidders.
- Issue addenda as appropriate to interpret, clarify or expand the Bidding Documents.
- Consult with and advise TPCG as to the acceptability of subcontractors, suppliers and other persons and organizations proposed by the prime contractor.
- Assist TPCG in the course of any negotiations with prospective contractors.
- Attend the bid opening, prepare bid tabulation sheets and assist TPCG in evaluating bids or proposals and in assembling and awarding contracts for construction.

Phase 5: Construction Phase

GIS shall provide construction administration services during the construction phase of the project. GIS shall serve as TPCG's representative and act on behalf of TPCG to the extent provided in the construction documents. GIS's service shall include the following:

- General administration of the construction contract.
- Preconstruction conference.
- Receive, review and determine acceptability of contractor schedule, submittals, shop drawings and rfi's.
- Submit to TCPG contractors defective work as necessary
- Receive, review and recommend pay applications
- Receive, review and initiate change orders and work directives as necessary to complete the work.
- Conduct regular site visit to ensure compliance.
- Conduct substantial completion inspection and provide punch list to TCPG for review.
- Conduct final inspection and provide TCPG with notice of acceptability of the work.

Civil Engineering Additional Services:

GIS shall provide the following tasks as additional services required for the design and construction of the project. These services are not included as part of the Basic Services. These additional services are required are required for the completion of the project.

Task 3: Reimbursable Expenses

Additional services under this task is for reimbursement for all equipment required through completion of this phase such as vehicles, cameras, qps, & project reproduction.

Task 4: Geotechnical Analysis and Engineering

GIS intends to contract out Eustis Engineering for the preparation of a Geotechnical Engineering report as an additional service. The geotechnical analysis and report shall include soil borings, laboratory analysis and recommendations by a Louisiana licensed Professional Engineer necessary to complete the design of the project including pavement design typical sections and pavement rehabilitation recommendations.

Task 6: Resident Project Representation

GIS shall provide resident project representation as an additional service through the construction phase of the project. A field project representative will be provided at the project location to provide more expanded observation of the required work. The Project Representative will be on-site to verify and observe construction as required by the specific stage of construction or scheduled construction activities.

Cost:

The fees for Engineering Services are listed below for each task. The Basic Services portion of this proposal are based on the State of Louisiana FP&C Standard Fee Calculation formula using an updated estimated construction cost of \$3.86 million. Basic Services would be rendered on a lump sum basis, while Additional Services on a time and material basis plus reimbursable expenses. A copy of our Standard Rate Schedule is enclosed as Exhibit A. A detailed summary of engineering services and associated budget for each task is as follows:

A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE K&B MACHINE WORKS, LLC FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE INDUSTRIAL TAX EXEMPTION PROGRAM AT TERREBONNE PARISH, LOUISIANA

WHEREAS, Article 7, Section 21(F) of the Louisiana Constitution provides for the Board of Commerce and Industry ("BCI"), with the approval of the Governor, to approve contracts for the exemption of ad valorem taxes of a new manufacturing establishment or an addition to an existing manufacturing establishment, on such terms and conditions as the board, with the approval of the Governor, deems in the best interest of the state; and

WHEREAS, K&B Machine Works, LLC has applied for an Industrial Tax Exemption ("ITE") and seeks approval of the BCI and the Governor for a contract granting that exemption; and

WHEREAS, Governor Edwards, through Executive Order JBE 16-26 and 16-73, as amended, has set forth the conditions for his approval of ITE contracts, and affirmed that those conditions are in the best interest of the State of Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order JBE 16-26 and 16-73, as amended, provides that ITE contracts should be premised upon job and payroll creation at new or expanded manufacturing plants or establishments, or upon showing that investment in modernization of the facility represents a compelling basis for retention of jobs and that the percentage of exemption from ad valorem taxes, and length of the contract for such exemption, may vary depending upon the nature of the project and its economic benefit in accordance with guidance received from the Secretary of Economic Development and concurred in by the Terrebonne Parish Council, school board and sheriff; and

WHERAS, Executive Order JBE 16-26 and 16-73, as amended, mandates that each exemption contract approved by the Governor shall include as Exhibit "A" a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement for the ITE between the State of Louisiana, the Louisiana Department of Economic Development, and the applicant for the ITE contract, which provides for the creation or retention of jobs, and provides for the exercise of the option in the Louisiana Constitution for the term or percentage of the parish ad valorem tax exemption granted in the contract, and provides for the reduction or loss of the exemption based on the applicant's compliance with the contract; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order JBE 16-26 and 16-73, as amended, further requires that this parish council, together with the other required local government entities signify consent to the terms of the exemption by resolution and the sheriff of this parish shall signify consent to the terms of the exemption by letter. Executive Order JBE 16-26 and 16-73, as amended, further provides that the resolutions of approval and the sheriff's approval shall be attached as Exhibit "B" to the ITE contract between BCI and K&B Machine Works, LLC; and

WHEREAS, K&B Machine Works, LLC and the Louisiana Department of Economic Development have advised that certain terms and conditions forming Exhibit "A" to the Industrial Tax Exemption Contract pending approval before the Louisiana Board of Commerce and Industry have been reached and have conveyed the same to this parish council, and thus this matter is now ready for a determination of approval of this parish council as required by JBE 16-26 and 16-73, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Council in consideration of JBE 16-26 and 16-73, as amended, and in accordance with Louisiana Administrative Code §501, et seq., Louisiana Revised Statutes 47:1703 and 47:4311, et seq., finds the project, contract, or purchase, as proposed and attached hereto, to be acceptable; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, upon consideration of the foregoing and the public discussion held this day that the Terrebonne Parish Council finds that K&B Machine Works, LLC has presented compelling evidence that as a result of the contemplated investment for which the exemption is being sought, it will create/ retain manufacturing jobs if this exemption is granted, approves the terms of the Industrial Tax Exemption contract based on the inclusion of the following terms and conditions into Exhibit "A" (the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement) between the State of Louisiana, the Louisiana Department of Economic Development, and K&B Machine Works, LLC to the Industrial Tax Exemption contract between the Board of Commerce and Industry and K&B Machine Works, LLC with respect to the manufacturing plant located at Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER JBE 2016 – 73

AMENDED AND RESTATED CONDITIONS FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE INDUSTRIAL TAX EXEMPTION PROGRAM

WHEREAS.

Article 7, Section 21(F) of the Louisiana Constitution provides that the State Board of Commerce and Industry "with the approval of the governor, may enter into contracts for the exemption from ad valorem taxes of a new manufacturing establishment or an addition to an existing manufacturing establishment, on such terms and conditions as the board, with the approval of the governor, deems in the best interest of the state";

WHEREAS,

Article 7, Section 21(F) also provides that the contracts for the exemption "shall be for an initial term of no more than five calendar years and may be renewed for an additional five years":

WHEREAS,

under past practices of the Board of Commerce and Industry and previous governors of Louisiana, this has resulted in a 100 percent exemption or abatement from local property taxes for an initial period of five years, plus the opportunity for a five-year renewal, for a total of ten years of full exemption from local property taxes for qualifying manufacturing establishments;

WHEREAS,

under past practices of the Board of Commerce and Industry and previous governors of Louisiana, exemption contracts, unlike those in most states, have allowed ad valorem tax exemptions for maintenance capital, environmental capital upgrades, and new replacements to existing machinery with the result that the same components of a manufacturing plant remain exempt from the local property taxes for years after the expiration of the ten-year period for the contract;

WHEREAS,

under past practices the Board of Commerce and Industry and previous governors of Louisiana, exemption contracts have been allowed for Miscellaneous Capital Additions without requiring these projects to file advance notifications, which may more accurately identify projects that will provide for the goals of economic development;

WHEREAS,

under past practices of the Board of Commerce and Industry and previous governors of Louisiana, there have been no job creation or capital investment thresholds required for eligibility for the program;

WHEREAS,

further, receipt of other incentives from the State by way of direct funding, rebates, tax credits, industrial bonds, or other similar incentives has not factored into determinations of the Board or Governor for eligibility or extent of the exemption or for the length of the contract for the exemption despite the discretionary provisions granted in Article 7, Section 21(F);

WHEREAS,

the Board of Commerce and Industry and previous governors of Louisiana have approved Industrial Tax Exemption contracts that and will result in an average of \$1.4 billion in foregone ad valorem tax revenue each year for the next five years for parishes, municipalities, school districts and other political subdivisions of the state directly providing law enforcement, water and sewage, infrastructure, and educational opportunities to Louisiana citizens;

WHEREAS,

Louisiana's adjacent states authorize local governments to grant discretionary exemptions based on the attractiveness of a particular project—in contrast with Louisiana where neither the Board of Commerce and Industry or previous administrations have, in the past, exercised discretion in awarding the Industrial Tax Credit Exemption authorized by the Louisiana Constitution;

WHEREAS,

as a result, Louisiana has forgone opportunities to negotiate and/or to offer prospects lesser or greater benefits under the Industrial Tax Exemption program based upon the merit of the project being considered; and

WHEREAS,

this practice has put Louisiana at a competitive disadvantage with neighboring states which use discretion in granting tax exemptions and thereby forgo less revenue by denying projects that will not create significant employment or sufficient capital investment.

NOW THEREFORE, I, JOHN BEL EDWARDS, Governor of the State of Louisiana, by virtue of the authority vested by the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, do hereby order and direct as follows:

SECTION 1:

This order provides the terms and conditions under which the Governor is to determine that contracts for the Industrial Tax Exemption Program are in the best interests of the State of Louisiana in accordance with Article 7, Section 21(F) of the Louisiana Constitution.

SECTION 2:

For all pending contractual applications for which no advance notification is required under the Rules of the Board of Commerce and Industry, except for such contracts that provide for new jobs at the completed manufacturing plants or establishments, this order is effective immediately; for all contracts for which advance notification is required under the Rules of the Board of Commerce and Industry, this order is effective for advance notifications filed after June 24, 2016. The requirements of this Executive Order do not apply to Industrial Tax Exemptions approved before June 24, 2016 or the renewal of those contracts. However, nothing in this Executive Order shall be interpreted to relieve any participants in the Industrial Tax Exemption Program from their contractual obligations.

SECTION 3:

Only contracts accompanied by advance notifications will be considered by the Governor. Applications for miscellaneous capital additions and applications for tax exemptions for maintenance capital, required environmental capital upgrades, and new replacements for existing machinery will not be approved or issued contracts by the Governor.

SECTION 4:

The Governor will not approve contracts unless the Board of Commerce and Industry has specifically determined that the establishment meets the constitutional definition of manufacturing. Exemption contracts for new manufacturing plants or establishments are favored by the Governor and exemption contracts for additions to any existing plant or establishment are not favored by the Governor unless they provide for new jobs or present compelling reasons for the retention of existing jobs.

*

SECTION 5:

All contracts providing for the Industrial Tax Exemption shall include Exhibit "A" consisting of a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between the State of Louisiana, the Louisiana Department of Economic Development, and the Applicant providing for the creation or retention of jobs and provisions for the exercise of the options in the Louisiana Constitution for the term or percentage of the exemption granted in the contract, and for the reduction or loss of the exemption based upon the applicant's compliance with the contract, provided with respect to the manufacturing project for which the exemption is granted will be approved by the Governor.



SECTION 6:



All Contracts providing for the Industrial Tax exemption shall also include Exhibit "B" consisting of approvals of the relevant governing Parish Council or Police Jury by resolution, Municipal Council by resolution, School Board by resolution and Sheriff by resolution signifying whether each of those authorities is in favor of the project. The Secretary of Economic Development will provide guidance to the local parties to Exhibit "B" as to the suggested alternatives for their consideration including parameters for job creation, payroll, percentages of exemption, and length of contract.



*

SECTION 7:

Only contracts including Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "B" as described herein will be approved by the Governor. Contracts for the Industrial Tax Exemption that do not meet these conditions will not be approved by the Governor. The Board of Commerce and Industry may address, by rule, any other contractual arrangements that it deems necessary and submit these to the Governor for consideration as amendments to this Executive Order.

SECTION 8:

The Department of Revenue shall, in coordination with the Louisiana Department of Economic Development, implement procedures and shall annually review all contracts subject to this Executive Order to assure compliance with existing law, this Order, and the terms of the Industrial Tax Exemption contract.

SECTION 9:

Article 7 Section 21(F) provides for an initial term for the contract of exemption to be "no more than five years" and that "the contract may be renewed for an additional five years"; and in determining whether to sign the initial contract or to renew an existing contract, the Board of Commerce and Industry and the Governor will consider the information collected and the provisions and conditions presented in Exhibits "A" and "B". In considering new contracts for approval the Governor will only approve those contracts having an initial term of five years or less and providing for an exemption of up to 100% of the manufacturing establishment. If renewal terms are provided for in the new contract, then the renewal contract will only be approved if the renewal term is limited to three years or less and provides for an exemption of up to 80% or less of the manufacturing establishment.

SECTION 10:

The terms for the Governor's approval of the contracts for the Industrial Tax Exemption as provided for in this Executive Order represent the primary cause for the Governor's execution of the contracts and any occurrence which operates to change or suspend the terms of any contract approved by the Board of Commerce and Industry and executed by the Governor after the effective date of this Executive Order shall render the approval of the Governor of the affected contract void and of no force or effect.

Whereas, Section 1-06 of the Home Rule Charter for the Parish of Terrebonne provides that the parish government shall have the right, power and authority to pass all ordinances requisite or necessary to promote, protect and preserve the general welfare, safety, health, peace and good order of the parish, including, but not by way of limitation, the right, power and authority to pass ordinances on all subject matter necessary, requisite or proper for the management of the parish affairs, and all other subject matter without exception, subject only to the limitations that the same shall not be inconsistent with the Constitution or expressly denied by the general law applicable to the parish; and

Whereas, Louisiana Constitutional article VII, Section 14, Part B(1) authorizes the TPCG to use "public funds for programs of social welfare for the aid and support of the needy";

Whereas, Louisiana Revised Statute 33:1236(11)(a) further authorizes the TPCG to "provide for the support of the poor and necessitous within [its] parish"; and

Whereas, Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government is in possession of five (5) buses, more fully described below, which were previously used in the Good Earth Transit system, and have now exceeded their useful life and have been removed from the rural transit program by the LA DOTD/FTA:

2011 Ford El Dorado, bearing VIN 1FDFE4FS5ADA85581 (valued at \$4,000.00); and 2011 Ford El Dorado, bearing VIN 1FDFE4FS7ADA86778 (valued at \$4,000.00); and 2011 Ford El Dorado, bearing VIN 1FDFE4FS7ADA85582 (valued at \$4,000.00); and 2011 Ford El Dorado, bearing VIN 1FDFE4FS1ADA78918 (valued at \$4,000.00); and 2011 Ford El Dorado, bearing VIN 1FDFE4FS3ADB02281 (valued at \$4,000.00); and

Whereas, the above described buses are now no longer needed for public use by the TPCG and are, in fact, not being used; and
