AN EXTREME EMERGENCY ORDINANCE DECLARING AN EMERGENCY PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 2-14, 5-04(b) AND 5-11 OF THE HOME RULE CHARTER FOR THE TERREBONNE PARISH COUNCIL TO EFFECTUATE THE APPROPRIATION OF EMERGENCY FUNDS FROM THE DEDICATED EMERGENCY CONTINGENCY FUND FOR PURPOSES OF PROTECTING THE HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE OF ITS CITIZENS REGARDING THE DESTRUCTION AND DAMAGES CAUSED BY HURRICANE IDA AND HURRICANE NICHOLAS.

WHEREAS, on August 26, 2021, Parish President Gordon E. Dove declared a State of Emergency relative to Hurricane Ida in Terrebonne Parish recorded in the Terrebonne Parish Courthouse under COB 2646, page 676, entry No. 1634123 (attached hereto as Exh. A), so that immediate action could take place to prepare for and address the natural disaster as afforded to him pursuant to La. R.S. 29:729 and the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Code, and

WHEREAS, on August 26, 2021, Governor John Bel Edwards declared a Gubernatorial State of Emergency for Hurricane Ida as 165 JBE 2021, and

WHEREAS, on September 14, 2021, Terrebonne Parish President Gordon Dove declared a State of Emergency to exist relative to Hurricane Nicholas in Terrebonne Parish recorded in the Terrebonne Parish Courthouse under COB 2646, page 840, entry No. 1634194 (attached hereto as Exh. B), so that immediate action could take place to prepare for and address the natural disaster as afforded to him pursuant to La. R.S. 29:729 (attached hereto as Exh. C) and the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Code, and

WHEREAS, on September 14, 2021, Governor John Bel Edwards declared a Gubernatorial State of Emergency for Hurricane Nicholas as 175 JBE 2021, and

WHEREAS, declaration of extreme public emergency was declared for Hurricanes Ida and Nicholas, and

WHEREAS, the extreme emergency caused necessary spending for the purpose of protecting the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens due to the destruction caused by Hurricanes Ida and Nicholas, and

WHEREAS, Hurricane Ida caused extensive infrastructure damage in Terrebonne Parish due to high winds, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Terrebonne Parish's Home Rule Charter, a dedicated emergency fund exists for the purpose of addressing the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Parish, and

WHEREAS, the Parish President and his Chief Financial Officer had a need to make expenditures from the dedicated emergency funding without Parish Council approval, and

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne parish Council has the authority to appropriate, authorize, and ratify the use of Emergency funds for emergencies such as Hurricanes Ida and Nicholas, pursuant to Terrebonne Parish Charter Section 5-11 (attached hereto as Exh. D), and

WHEREAS, the appropriation of emergency fund spending can be authorized by an Emergency Ordinance pursuant to Terrebonne Parish Charter Section 2-14 (attached hereto as Exh. E), and

WHEREAS, the Parish President is vested with the responsibility to respond to an emergency in order to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Parish pursuant to La. R.S. 29:727 (attached hereto as Exh. F), and

WHEREAS, the Parish President is statutorily mandated and responsible for Homeland Security and emergency preparedness of Terrebonne Parish pursuant to La. R.S. 29:729.

SECTION I

THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, that in accordance with Article 5, Section 5-04(b) of the Terrebonne Parish Charter, the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, in association with the Parish President and Parish administration, hereby declares, approves, and ratifies the use of the dedicated emergency fund referenced in Article 5, Section 5-11 of the Terrebonne Parish Charter in order to meet a public emergency affecting life, health, property, and the public peace of its citizens in response to Hurricanes Ida and Nicholas, and

SECTION II

To the extent applicable, the Council Clerk shall cause all necessary notices and publications to occur with respect to the subject ordinance.

SECTION III

If any work, clause, phrase, section, or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, the remaining words, clauses, phrases, sections, and other portions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect, the provisions of this ordinance hereby being declared to be severable.

SECTION IV

This ordinance shall become effective upon approval by the Parish President or as otherwise provided in Section 2-13(b) of the Home Rule Charter for a Consolidated Government for Terrebonne Parish, whichever occurs sooner.

BY ORDER OF THE OFFICE OF THE PARISH PRESIDENT OF TERREBONNE:

WHEREAS, due to the developing threat of flooding, heavy rainfall, and hurricane force winds throughout the Parish of Terrebonne due to Tropical Depression #9, and in the event if become a Tropical Storm/Hurricane to be named IDA; and

WHEREAS, the Parish President of Terrebonne seeks to issue an Executive Order on this day, declaring a parish-wide state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, due to the developing threat of flooding, excessive rainfall, and hurricane force winds within Terrebonne Parish, Gordon E. Dove, as Parish President of Terrebonne Parish, seeks to invoke all rights and duties afforded him under Louisiana Revised Statute 29:721 and Terrebonne Parish Consolidation Government — Charter Sec. 3-01 et seq., and Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government Code Sec. 7-5 Homeland Security, until further notice; and

WHEREAS, the anticipated effect of the potential flooding, rainfall, and hurricane force winds upon all of Terrebonne Parish's people and property will require immediate action by Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government to offset the potentially irreparable damages; and

WHEREAS, without immediate and thorough governmental intervention, the natural habitat, intrinsic character, and economy of Terrebonne Parish may be forever detrimentally impacted; and

WHEREAS, Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, through Gordon E. Dove, as Parish President, is empowered to take all necessary measures to ensure the safety, health and welfare of the citizens of Terrebonne Parish, as per law, including undertaking various emergency works projects as authorized by the emergency provisions of the Louisiana Public Bid Law; and

WHEREAS, the Parish President further suspends customary local procurement procedures as necessary to ensure the health, safety and welfare needs of the people and property of Terrebonne Parish while coping with the effects of Tropical Depression #9, and in the event if become a Tropical Storm/Hurricane to be named IDA; and

WHEREAS, immediate action by the Parish of Terrebonne is mandatory to fulfill the needs of the people of this Parish; and therefore

IT IS ORDERED, that there be a Parish-wide state of emergency; and

IT IS ORDERED, that the Office of the Parish President invokes all rights and remedies afforded it under all the laws and constitutions of the United States and State of Louisiana; and

IT IS ORDERED, that the Office of the Parish President invokes all rights and remedies afforded it under Louisiana Revised Statutes; and

IT IS ORDERED, that the Office of the Parish President invokes all rights and remedies afforded it under the Terrebonne Parish Charter and Code of Ordinances; and

EXECUTIVE ORDER

IT IS ORDERED, through the Office of the Parish President, that the Parish initiate all emergency operations plans and commence action to prepare for any potential impact from flooding; and

IT IS ORDERED, that the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government and any other appropriate and designated local, state, or federal governmental entities and their contractors, employees, agents, volunteers, and assigns are authorized to initiate action to combat the potentially devastating effects of flood waters, rainfall and winds from Tropical Depression #9, and in the event if become a Tropical Storm/Hurricane to be named IDA including undertaking various emergency public works projects as authorized by the emergency provisions of the Louisiana Public Bid Law; and

IT IS ORDERED, that all standard local and parish procurement procedures are suspended to ensure the health, safety and welfare needs of the people and property of Terrebonne Parish while coping with the effects of flooding, rainfall and winds Tropical Depression #9, and in the event if become a Tropical Storm/Hurricane to be named IDA; and

IT IS ORDERED that the Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness Director, Earl Eues, (985) 873-6357, be hereby designated as point of contact; and

IT IS ORDERED, that any person or entity that interrupts or interferes with the control of the Parish and/or Parish President shall be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law; and

IT IS ORDERED, the Parish President will mandate, as necessary, TPCG workforce as circumstances require, due to the effects of Tropical Depression #9, and in the event if become a Tropical Storm/Hurricane to be named IDA; and

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this order by recorded with the Terrebonne Parish Clerk of Court and given prompt and general publicity and filed with the Office of Emergency Preparedness, all in accordance with La. R.S. 29:727.

BY ORDER OF THE OFFICE OF THE PARISH PRESIDENT OF TERREBONNE:

WHEREAS, due to the developing threat of flooding, extra-tropical rainfall, and tropical storm force winds throughout the Parish of Terrebonne due to tropical event identified as Tropical Storm and/or Hurricane Nicholas; and

WHEREAS, the Parish President of Terrebonne seeks to issue an Executive Order on this day, declaring a parish-wide state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, due to the developing threat of flooding, extra-tropical rainfall, and tropical storm force winds within Terrebonne Parish, Gordon E. Dove, as Parish President of Terrebonne Parish, seeks to invoke all rights and duties afforded him under Louisiana Revised Statute 29:721 and Terrebonne Parish Consolidation Government — Charter Sec. 3-01 et seq., and Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government Code Sec. 7-5 Homeland Security, until further notice

WHEREAS, the anticipated effect of the potential flooding, rainfall, and tropical storm force winds upon all of Terrebonne Parish's people and property will require immediate action by Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government to offset the potentially irreparable damages; and

WHEREAS, without immediate and thorough governmental intervention, the natural habitat, intrinsic character, and economy of Terrebonne Parish may be forever detrimentally impacted; and

WHEREAS, Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, through Gordon E. Dove, as Parish President, is empowered to take all necessary measures to ensure the safety, health and welfare of the citizens of Terrebonne Parish, as per law, including undertaking various emergency works projects as authorized by the emergency provisions of the Louisiana Public Bid Law; and

WHEREAS, the Parish President further suspends customary local procurement procedures as necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare needs of the people and property of Terrebonne Parish while coping with the effects of Tropical Storm and/or Hurricane Nicholas; and

WHEREAS, immediate action by the Parish of Terrebonne is mandatory to fulfill the needs of the people of this Parish; and therefore

WHEREAS the Governor of the State of Louisiana declared Emergency Proclamation Number 173 JBE 2021.

IT IS ORDERED, that there be a Parish-wide state of emergency.

IT IS ORDERED, that the Office of the Parish President invokes all rights and remedies afforded it under all the laws and constitutions of the United States and State of Louisiana; and

IT IS ORDERED, that the Office of the Parish President invokes all rights and remedies afforded it under Louisiana Revised Statutes; and

IT IS ORDERED, that the Office of the Parish President invokes all rights and remedies afforded it under the Terrebonne Parish Charter and Code of Ordinances; and

IT IS ORDERED, through the Office of the Parish President, that the Parish initiate all emergency operations plans and commence action to prepare for any potential impact from flooding; and

IT IS ORDERED, that the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government and any other appropriate and designated local, state, or federal governmental entities and their contractors, employees, agents, volunteers, and assigns are authorized to initiate action to combat the potentially devastating effects of flood waters, rainfall, and winds from Tropical Storm and/or Hurricane Nicholas including undertaking various emergency public works projects as authorized by the emergency provisions of the Louisiana Public Bid Law; and

IT IS ORDERED, that all standard local and parish procurement procedures are suspended to ensure the health, safety, and welfare needs of the people and property of Terrebonne Parish while coping with the effects of flooding, rainfall, and winds from Tropical Storm and/or Hurricane Nicholas; and

IT IS ORDERED that the Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness Director, Earl Eues, (985) 873-6357, be hereby designated as point of contact; and

IT IS ORDERED, that any person or entity that interrupts or interferes with the control of the Parish and/or Parish President shall be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this order by recorded with the Terrebonne Parish Clerk of Court and given prompt and general publicity and filed with the Office of Emergency Preparedness, all in accordance with La. R.S. 29:727.

Purchasing of all property, supplies, materials and services shall be under a central purchasing system and shall be in accordance with applicable state law, council policy and administrative requirements.

Sec. 5-11. Dedication of Emergency Fund.

Each year there shall be a minimum appropriation of \$200,000.00, or 3% of general fund revenues based on the previous year final audited revenues, whichever amount is greater, dedicated to an emergency fund account. All funds so appropriated and any interest accruing thereon shall be placed in this dedicated fund and shall be subject to the provisions of this section. In the event the fund has a balance of at least \$1,500,000.00, the appropriation mandated herein shall become discretionary for all such periods of time that the fund has a balance of at least \$1,500,000.00. Every two (2) years the cap of \$1,500,000.00 will be increased by increments of \$250,000.00 to a maximum cap of \$5,000,000.00 which may be increased by a 2/3 vote of the Council.

In order for any appropriation to be made from the emergency fund created by this section, there must be an emergency as provided in section 5-04 (b), and a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the authorized membership of the Council shall be required for any such appropriation.

After the expiration of one (1) year, the ordinance may be amended or repealed as any other ordinance.

The results shall be determined by a majority vote of the electors voting on the proposal.
- (7) If a majority of the qualified electors voting on a proposed initiative ordinance vote in its favor, it shall be considered adopted upon certification of the election results. If conflicting ordinances are approved at the same election, the one receiving the greatest number of affirmative votes shall prevail to the extent of such conflict.
- (8) An ordinance adopted by the electorate through the initiative process shall not be amended or repealed by council action for a period of one (1) year after the election at which it was adopted, but thereafter it may be amended or repealed as any other ordinance.
- (9) Ordinances adopted through the initiative process shall not be subject to veto by the president.

- (a) Any elected official of the Parish Government may be removed from office by the electors of the Parish through a recall process. The recall procedure shall be the same as is provided in the general laws of the state.
- (b) If, in a recall election, the majority of those voting vote for recall, the official named in the recall petition shall be removed ipso facto from office, and the vacancy thereby created shall be filled as in the case of ordinary vacancies in accordance with this charter. - G. Members of the task force shall be entitled to be reimbursed for actual expenses for travel consistent with allowances for state classified employees and approved by the director of the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness, if funding is available.
- H. The task force, acting pursuant to its authority provided in this Section, may not supplant the authority of an individual cemetery authority that seeks to manage its own disaster response and communicates that desire in writing to the task force.

- B. Each parish president is hereby authorized and directed to establish an office of homeland security and emergency preparedness for the respective parish.
- C. Each parish president shall maintain a homeland security and emergency preparedness agency which, except as otherwise provided under this Chapter, has jurisdiction over and serves the entire parish.

The annual report shall address those issues identified by the director in consultation with the regional parish office of emergency preparedness parish directors' subcommittee pursuant to R.S. 29:725.6(B)(6)(c) by January first of each year.

(5) The requirement of the parish or police jury president to form a parish emergency advisory committee may be satisfied through any existing committee formed within the parish for the purpose of addressing the issues of homeland security and emergency preparedness provided that such existing committee meets the membership requirement set forth in Paragraph (3) of this Subsection.







A Proposal to Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana

Strategic Counsel and Representational Services with Respect to Hurricane Ida Recovery Efforts

PROPOSED TERM OF THE REPRESENTATION AGREEMENT

VNF Solutions proposes that the representation of the Terrebonne Parish begin as soon as the Parish determines to engage the firm and will continue for six months. At the end of the sixmonth term, both parties to the agreement may agree to continue the agreement, with or without mutually agreeable modifications.

PROPOSED FINANCIAL TERMS OF THE REPRESENTATION AGREEMENT

VNF Solutions proposes that the financial terms of the representation agreement be a monthly retainer of \$15,000. VNF Solutions proposes that this monthly retainer cover all expenses associated with this representation except out-of-town travel, overnight lodging and meals when VNF Solutions professionals are away from Washington, DC or, in the case of Tanner Johnson, Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

Disaster Recovery Team Biographies

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING SECTION 21-34 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO NAME THE SPLASH PARK LOCATED AT THE HOUMA AIRBASE AFTER MELVIN JOHNSON, JR

WHEREAS, Section 2-11 of the Terrebonne Parish Home Rule Charter requires an ordinance to amend or repeal previous Ordinances; adopt or amend an administrative code; and establish a rule or regulation imposing fines or other penalties; and

WHEREAS, Melvin Johnson, Jr. had a standout athletic career while attending South Terrebonne High School, and

WHEREAS, Melvin Johnson, Jr. sadly passed away in 1980, and

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Council wishes to preserve the impact the late Melvin Johnson, Jr. had on the field and in the community by honoring him in naming the Splash Park located on 218 FOP Court, Houma, Louisiana, the "Melvin Johnson, Jr. Splash Park."

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Terrebonne Parish Council on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government that:

SECTION I

Section 21-34 of the Terrebonne Parish Code shall be enacted (using strikethrough to indicate deletions and underlining to indicate additions) and same are hereby adopted to read as follows:

Sec. 21-34. – Naming of the Splash Park.

(a) The Splash Park, located on 218 FOP Court, Houma, Louisiana, is hereby named the Melvin Johnson, Jr. Splash Park.

SECTION II

Any section, clause, paragraph, provision, or portion of these regulations found to be invalid is severable and shall not affect the validity of the whole.

SECTION III

This ordinance shall become effective upon approval by the Parish President or as otherwise provided in Section 2-13(b) of the Home Rule Charter for a Consolidated Government for Terrebonne Parish, whichever occurs sooner.

Any section, clause, paragraph, provision, or portion of these regulations found to be invalid is severable and shall not affect the validity of the whole.
