

## PROJECT SUMMARY (200 WORDS OR LESS)

Resolution authorizing the president to sign a change order agreement with Wilco Marsh Buggies and Draglines, Inc. to complete the construction of terraces intended to reduce the wave fetch north of the lake, capture debris, and lower the risk of flooding for residences and public buildings. Due to additional terraces being completed, rain, the hurricane, and the loss of plants to the cold winter, changes in the period of performance and scope are necessary. The change has been recommended by C. H. Fenstermaker, the engineering and construction management firm of record, and approved as cost effective and programmatically correct by the State.

# PROJECT PURPOSE & BENEFITS (150 WORDS OR LESS)

The LA SAFE program has awarded \$3.6M to put the terraces in place to create land again in the area above Lake Boudreaux. The goal is to create 300 acres of terraces in areas that were once solid land and are now open water thereby slowing the wave action during storms and creating habitat at all times. This resolution authorizes the Parish President to accept the change order to the contract to accept the additional terraces, lower the plant count, and provide a 45-day extension prior to liquidated damages applying.

- A resolution authorizing the Parish President to enter into the change order to the agreement between Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government and Wilco Marsh Buggies to construct the LA SAFE Living Mitigation terraces project above Lake Boudreaux. The engineer has recommended the change. The period of performance will be extended 45-days rather than the 55 requested in order to minimize any effect on the Apache duck leases. There were rain days and the storm, but the firm delayed their start by more than a month, and then took on emergency work that has slowed their performance on the terraces.
- There will be more terraces and fewer plants than the original plan, but a spring planting will replace those that died in the cold winter and reflect the original plant count for stabilization. The plants available are being planted on the completed terraces now. The spring planting will be handled with a new procurement for a plant and planting contractor.

#### **Description:**

Due to the impacts of Hurricane Ida, the contract time is being extended by 36 days to make up for lost contract time when no work was performed between August 26, 2021 and October 2, 2021. The contract time is also being extended by an additional 5 days to allow for the construction of the additional linear footage of terraces as described below. Finally, 4 additional weather days are being added to the contract time to make up for weather days beyond the contract allotted weather days during the months of May and June. Thus, the total additional contract days is 45. Should the allowable Contract Time be exceeded, the Liquidated Damages are \$1,500 per calendar day required to complete the unfinished work. No work shall be performed on November 13, 14, 25, or 26, 2021. These days will not count against the Contract Time or Liquidated Damages.

A number of the shrub species that were being grown for this project did not survive the winter freezes. The quantity of those species is being adjusted to what is available. The as built drawings shall include the locations of the shrub species.

A portion of the terraces were improperly staked in the field, resulting in an overbuild of the first lift. This error was identified prior to making the second lift. Based on the recommendation of the engineer, a decision was made to add this additional linear footage to the contract, rather than have the Contractor degrade the overbuilt sections.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 21-30(A) AND SECTION 21-31 OF CHAPTER 21, RECREATION AND PARKS, ARTICLE II PARISH GENERALLY, OF THE TERREBONNE PARISH CODE.

WHEREAS, Sec. 1-06 of the Home Rule Charter for the Parish of Terrebonne provides that parish government shall have the right, power and authority to pass all ordinances requisite or necessary to promote, protect and preserve the general welfare, safety, health, peace and good order of the parish, including, but not by way of limitation, the right, power and authority to pass ordinances on all subject matter necessary, requisite or proper for the management of parish affairs, and all other subject matter without exception, subject only to the limitation that the same shall not be inconsistent with the constitution or expressly denied by general law applicable to the parish; and

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Council and Terrebonne Parish Administration wishes to include Houma Heights Park under Section 21-30(a) and Section 21-31 in order to establish hours of operation and list the park as a drug free zone for the use and enjoyment of the citizens of Terrebonne Parish; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, that the following be enacted:

#### SECTION I

Chapter 21, Article II, Section 21-30(a) and Section 21-31 of the Terrebonne Parish Code be amended as per the attached Exhibit A.

#### **SECTION II**

If any word, clause, phrase, section or other portion of this ordinance shall be declared null, void, invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, the remaining words, clauses, phrases, sections and other portions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect, the provisions of this ordinance hereby being declared to be severable.

#### SECTION III

This ordinance shall become effective upon approval by the Parish President.

This ordinance, having been introduced and laid on the table for at least two weeks, was voted upon as follows:



An ordinance amending the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances, Chapter 26. Utilities, Article II. Electricity, Division 2. Service Rates and Charges, providing a fee therein for Renewable Resource Net Metering.

Whereas, the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government (TPCG), governing authority of the Parish of Terrebonne and City of Houma Louisiana, operates and maintains a combined electric and natural gas utility system ("the System") organized under its Department of Utilities ("the Department"); and

Whereas, Section 2-11 of the Terrebonne Parish Home Rule Charter requires an ordinance to amend or repeal previous Ordinances; adopt or amend an administrative code; and establish a rule or regulation imposing fines or other penalties; and

**Whereas**, the System provides retail electric utility service within the corporate limits of the City of Houma and immediately adjacent geographic areas; and

Whereas, the Louisiana Renewable Energy Development Act ("the Act"), adopted as Act 653 by the Louisiana Legislature in their 2003 legislative session and codified as Chapter 50, Article 3061 et seq of the Louisiana Revised Statutes, requires all Louisiana electric utilities to "allow net energy metering facilities to be interconnected using a meter capable of registering the flow of electricity in two directions"; and

Whereas, the Act further requires that the Louisiana Public Service Commission ("LPSC") establish appropriate rates, terms, and conditions for net energy metering contracts, including the assessment of a greater fee or charge if the costs of net energy metering outweigh the benefits of allocating the cost among the entire customer base, and that the net metering customer reimburse the utility for any costs in excess of those to serve a traditional customer; and

**Whereas**, by General Order the LPSC has established such regulations, commonly collectively referred to as the "Louisiana Net Metering Rules", and

Whereas, the System is not subject to the jurisdiction of the LPSC but often relies on their orders as a guide to establishing parallel fees and regulations in the absence of compelling reasons to do otherwise, and

Whereas, TPCG engaged the services of GDS Associates, a professional utility consultant, to review the Louisiana Net Metering Rules and the similar fees of selected municipal electric utilities within and outside Louisiana and to recommend a fee for the System, and

Whereas, consistent with those recommendations, the Department has drafted and recommends a fee for the System to be incorporated into the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances.

**Now Therefore Be It Ordained** by the Terrebonne Parish Council on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government that the following Section 26-47 be appended to Terrebonne Parish Code Chapter 26. Utilities, Article II. Electricity, Division 2. Services Rates and Charges.

#### **SECTION I**

Section 26-47 of the Terrebonne Parish Code shall be enacted (using strikethrough to indicate deletions and underlining to indicate additions) and same are hereby adopted to read as follows:

# Sec. 26-47. – Renewable Resource Net Metering

- (a) <u>Availability</u>. This schedule, available as a supplement to customers of any class throughout the territory served by the electric utility, applies to the synchronous interconnection of qualified renewable energy resources and the compensation for excess energy delivered to the electric utility.
- (b) <u>Qualified Resources</u>. Only those resources meeting all requirements of this paragraph (b) shall be considered <u>Qualified Resources</u>, being those resources which may qualify customers as being eligible for service under this schedule
  - (1) The following types of renewal energy resources shall be considered *Qualified Resources* 
    - Photovoltaic
    - Wind
    - Biomass
    - Hydroelectric
  - Geothermal Electric
  - Fuel Cell
  - Renewable Fuel
  - (2) <u>Qualified Resources</u> shall be limited in capacity to 25 kilowatts for the Residential customer class, 300 kilowatts for General Service customer classes, and in aggregate kilowatts to 0.5% of the annual electric utility peak demand.
  - (3) Only customer-owned renewable energy resources connected on the customer side of the electric utility meter and sized to meet all or part of the customer's electricity requirements shall be considered *Qualified Resources*.

## (c) Interconnection.

- (1) <u>Application</u>. Application for service under this schedule shall be made to the Department of Utilities in the form prescribed by the Department of Utilities.
- (2) <u>Interconnection Agreement</u>. Approved applicants shall be required to execute a form of <u>Interconnection Agreement prescribed by the Department of Utilities setting forth the commercial and technical terms of service not otherwise provided herein.</u>
- (3) <u>Metering</u>. The Department of Utilities shall install or cause to be installed appropriate bi-directional kilowatt-hour metering, the cost of which shall be deferred by the applicant customer as hereinafter provided.

#### (d) *Charges and Credits*.

- (1) <u>Customer Charge</u>. A charge of \$5.00 shall apply to each account serviced under this schedule each month in addition to all other charges applicable under this section and the Customer Charge for the applicable customer classification as elsewhere provided in this chapter.
- (2) Demand and Energy Charges and Energy Credits.
  - a. <u>Demand and Energy Charges</u>. Power and energy charges for metered kilovoltampere demand and/or kilowatt-hour energy consumption shall be as prescribed for the applicable customer class as elsewhere provided in this chapter.
  - b. <u>Energy Credits</u>. Metered <u>Qualified Resource</u> production in kilowatt-hours in excess of consumption and delivered to the electric utility shall result in <u>Energy Credits</u> in <u>kWh</u>, which kWh credits shall accumulate month-to-month, the total of which shall be compensable on an annual basis at a unit rate equal to the electric utility's average avoided wholesale cost of energy effective on or before December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year, which amount shall be credited to the customer account.

- c. On the last bill in December, if an amount is owed to a customer for energy credits, it shall first be deducted from the December electricity utilities bill by TPCG. If the credit owed exceeds the December bill, TPCG shall refund payment to the customer.
- d. <u>Renewable Energy Credits</u>. Any renewable energy credits accrued as a result of or in any way attributable to the installation and/or operation of any <u>Qualified Resource</u> under this section shall be the sole property of the customer, who shall be solely responsible for any accounting or transacting of said credits for his sole benefit.

# **SECTION II**

Any section, clause, paragraph, provision, or portion of these regulations found to be invalid is severable and shall not affect the validity of the whole.

#### RS 51:3061

#### CHAPTER 50. LOUISIANA RENEWABLE ENERGY

#### DEVELOPMENT ACT

§3061. Legislative findings

The legislature hereby finds and declares that:

- (1) Net energy metering encourages the use of renewable energy resources and renewable energy technologies. Increasing the consumption of renewable energy resources promotes the wise use of Louisiana's natural energy resources to meet a growing energy demand, increases Louisiana's use of indigenous energy fuels and fosters investment in emerging renewable technologies to stimulate economic development and job creation in the state.
- (2) Louisiana should actively encourage the manufacture of new technologies through promotion of emerging energy technologies. Net energy metering could help to further attract energy technology manufacturers, providing a foothold for these technologies in the Louisiana economy, and easier customer access to these technologies.

#### RS 51:3062

#### §3062. Definitions

As used in this Chapter, the following words and phrases shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this Section, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

- (1) "Commission" means the Louisiana Public Service Commission or other appropriate governing body for an electric utility.
- (2) "Electric utility" means a public or investor-owned utility, an electric cooperative, municipal utility, or any private power supplier or marketer that is engaged in the business of supplying electric energy to the ultimate consumer.
- (3) "Net energy metering" means measuring the difference between electricity supplied by an electric utility and the electricity generated by a net energy metering customer and sold back to the electric utility over the applicable billing period.
- (4) "Net energy metering customer" means an owner of a net energy metering facility.
- (5) "Net energy metering facility" means a facility for the production of electrical energy that:
- (a) Uses solar, wind, hydroelectric, geothermal, or biomass resources to generate electricity including but not limited to fuel cells and micro turbines that generate electricity if the fuel source is entirely derived from renewable resources.
- (b) Has a generating capacity of not more than twenty-five kilowatts for residential use or three hundred kilowatts for commercial or agricultural use.
- (c) Is located in Louisiana.
- (d) Can operate with an electric utility's existing transmission and distribution facilities.
- (e) Is intended primarily to offset part or all of the net energy metering customer requirements for electricity.

#### RS 51:3063

#### §3063. Net energy metering

- A. An electric utility that offers residential or commercial electrical service, or both, shall allow net energy metering facilities to be interconnected using a meter capable of registering the flow of electricity in two directions.
- B. The commission, after notice and opportunity for public comment:
- (1) Shall establish appropriate rates, terms, and conditions for net energy metering contracts.
- (2) Shall authorize an electric utility to assess a net energy metering customer a greater fee or charge, of any type, if the electric utility's direct costs of interconnection and administration of net energy metering outweigh the distribution system, environmental, and public policy benefits of allocating the cost among the electric utility's entire customer base. The net metering customer shall reimburse the utility for any costs in excess of those to serve a traditional customer.
- C. Nothing in this Chapter shall derogate from the commission's constitutional authority to regulate, as applicable, all common carriers and public utilities, particularly the authority to implement rules, regulations, and tariffs to ensure that neither an electric utility nor its ratepayers shall be adversely affected, or to subsidize activities authorized under this Chapter.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that Section 4 entitled "Termination of District" in the Bond Ordinance shall be amended to read as follows:

**SECTION 4.** <u>Termination of District.</u> If the registered voters within the boundaries of each Terrebonne Recreation District No. 1, 2-3, No. 8, and No. 9 fail to approve *ad valorem* taxes for the purpose of providing financial support of the operation and capital improvements for the District on or before <u>April 30, 2022</u>, the District created herein shall terminate by operation of law and sunset on <u>April 30, 2022</u> without any further action by the Council or the governing authority of the District.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that this Amending and Supplemental Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon the signature of the Council Chairman.

The Parish posted a competitive request for proposals for a professional consultant to perform all aspects of data collection for substantial damage determinations of affected residential and non-residential structures as required by the local floodplain management ordinance for participation in the NFIP. All final determinations will be developed with SDE 3.0. The Parish does not have the capacity to perform the needed standard inspections and thousands of inspections of damages and destroyed buildings after Hurricane Ida. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has been authorized through the Disaster Recovery Act Section 1206 to pay up to 90% of the cost of the consultant fees.

#### PROJECT PURPOSE & BENEFITS (150 WORDS OR LESS)

The Parish is required to determine the extent of damages on all houses in the special flood hazard area that may not be compliant with the current base flood elevation standards required by the NFIP. Structures that are substantially damaged must be informed of the determination and the obligations under the Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance to elevate, relocate, or demolish the structure. FEMA will pay a procured consultant for site inspections for substantial damage determinations through the SDE 3.0 software. The purpose of this Resolution is to authorize the Parish President to enter into the appropriate agreement with Desire Line, LLC to provide the needed consultant services for the Terrebonne Parish programs.

#### RESOLUTION

A resolution adopted by the Consolidated Waterworks District No. 1 of the parish of Terrebonne, Louisiana to request an amendment to the per diem amount that its Board members receive for regular and special meetings

WHEREAS, the Consolidated Waterworks District No. 1 of the parish of Terrebonne, Louisiana (Waterworks) is a political subdivision of the state of Louisiana created by the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government in Chapter 27 of the Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances pursuant to La. R.S. 33:7712 and governed by a Board of Commissioners pursuant to that said law and La. R.S. 33:3819; and

WHEREAS, Waterworks' nine commissioners on its board are appointed by the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government (TPCG) Council so that each commissioner represents the district in which he lives, said districts being coterminous with the councilmanic districts of the TPCG Council;

WHEREAS, Waterworks believes that its Board of Commissioners performs its duties in an effective manner, working diligently both during and outside its regular and special meetings to insure that all residents, businesses and firefighters have a consistent supply of potable water; and

WHEREAS, the Louisiana legislature dictates what per diem pay is available to all Louisiana waterworks board members for its meetings, and in 2020 the legislature amended La. R.S.33:3819 so as to change the amount of available per diem pay from sixty dollars per meeting to an amount not to exceed what members of the Louisiana legislature receive for its per diem payments, which is contained in La.R.S. 24:31, which references 26 USC § 162(h)(1)(B(ii), and which is currently reported to be \$161; and

WHEREAS, La.R.S.33:3819 delegates the duty to set all Louisiana waterworks boards of commissioners' per diems to the local governing bodies of the respective parishes, with all funds used for such per diems to be paid solely by the respective waterworks, and currently the TPCG Council has set Waterworks members' per diems at sixty dollars; Waterworks believes that this Council should change the per diem amounts to reflect the recent amendment to La. R.S.33:3819; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to La. R.S.33:3819, the Consolidated Waterworks District No. 1 of the parish of Terrebonne, Louisiana hereby requests that Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government Council amend the per diem amount paid to Waterworks Board of Commissioners to an amount which equals but does not exceed what members of the Louisiana legislature receive for its per diem payments, with said per diems continued to be paid solely with Waterworks' funds.


