WHEREAS, under the provisions of Article VI, Section 20 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974 and R.S. 33:1324.1, a political subdivision may exercise and perform any authorized power and function, including financing, jointly or in cooperation with one or more political subdivisions, and

WHEREAS, it is the objective of The Communications District and The Fire Districts to utilize the enhanced 911 Telephone System within Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana to provide direct dispatch for emergency fire calls received via 9-1-1, and

WHEREAS, all things necessary or proper to render this Agreement ("Agreement") a valid and binding obligation of The Communications District and The Fire Districts have been done, and the signing, sealing, execution and delivery thereof has been in all respects duly authorized;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth to be kept and performed by the parties hereto, it is agreed by and between the parties, as follows:

ARTICLE I.

RESPONSIBILITY OF THE COMMUNICATIONS DISTRICT

- 1.1 In order to utilize the enhanced 911 Telephone System within Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana to provide direct dispatch for fire service response calls received by 911, The Communications District agrees to:
 - 1.1.1 Designate in writing a person to act as The Communications District's representative with respect to the services to be rendered under this agreement. Such person shall have complete authority for coordination with The Fire Districts and to transmit and receive information on behalf of The Communications District. (See Exhibit B)

- 1.1.2 Pay the cost of furnishing, installing and maintaining all enhanced 9-1-1 equipment and telephone service.
- 1.1.3 Be responsible for the cost of training, seminars, and accommodation expenditures incurred in the initial and continuing training of The Communications District's personnel.
- 1.1.4 Provide fire dispatch services meeting Property Insurance Association of Louisiana (PIAL) and National Fire Protection Association ("NFPA") Guidelines for 9,999 alarms per year or less and Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA's) National Incident Management System protocol.
- 1.1.5 Dispatch emergency fire calls in accordance with The TerrebonneParish Communications District's E-911 System Standard OperatingGuidelines.
- 1.1.6 Invoice The Fire Districts for services on an annual basis.
- 1.1.7 Provide respective fire department alert page tone and primary dispatch information as depicted in departmental provided protocol. (See Exhibit C)

ARTICLE II.

RESPONSIBILITY OF THE FIRE DISTRICTS

- 2.1 In order to utilize the enhanced 9-1-1 Telephone System within Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana to provide direct dispatch for fire service response calls received by 911, The Fire Districts agree to:
 - 2.1.1 Designate in writing a person to act as The Fire Districts' representative and with respect to such person provide:

- a) The Fire District's mailing address, telephone number and facsimile number;
- b) The Fire District Representative's home telephone number, mobile telephone number, pager number, work telephone number, work facsimile number and valid email address.
- 2.1.2 Each Fire District shall pay the annual fee as set out on Exhibit "A" within forty-five (45) days of the receipt of the invoice from The Communications District.
- 2.1.3 Follow Responder Radio Protocol as established in The Terrebonne Parish Communications District's E-911 System Standard Operating Guidelines as approved by majority vote of the Terrebonne Fire Chief's Association.
- 2.1.4 Obtain and maintain a Federal Communications Commission Radio Frequency License and the necessary pagers, mobiles, portables and base stations to receive dispatching.
- 2.1.5 Provide the following information and immediately notify The Communications Dist. in writing of any subsequent changes and/or additions:
 - a) Telephone and facsimile numbers of each station and substation;
 - b) All station assignments;
 - c) All unit and apparatus assignments;
- d) The name, contact telephone number, pager tone, unit number and pager number for each unit.
- 2.1.6 Update/approve departmental protocol information prior to the end of the first month of each year or at a minimum two weeks prior to enacting changes with dispatch procedures. (See Exhibit C)

ARTICLE III.

INSURANCE

- 3.1 Each party shall secure and maintain, at its expense, such insurance that will protect it, and the parties from claims under the Workers' Compensation Acts and from claims of bodily injury, death or property damage which may arise from the performance of services under this Agreement. Each Party shall also secure and maintain a Comprehensive General Liability (CGL) policy to protect from any injury, death or property damage with limits not less than One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) for one person, and not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for any one occurrence. The insurance for property damage shall be in the minimum amount of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for each accident.
- 3.2 In lieu thereof, each Party may carry a \$500,000 Combined Single Limit (CSL) policy with at least a \$1,000,000 aggregate.
- 3.3 Each policy holder will endorse Contractual Liability to protect the other party from the comprehensive general liability assumed under the agreement.
- 3.4 Each party shall have endorsed to all policies Waivers of Subrogation, a 30-day Notice of Cancellation, and respective parties listed as Additional Insured.
- 3.5 All policies of insurance shall be with a carrier that is no less than A++ rating.

ARTICLE IV.

DURATION OF AGREEMENT

4.1 It is recognized by the parties hereto, that this agreement shall become effective January 1, 2020 and shall remain in full force and effect through December 31, 2020, unless terminated in accordance with the provisions of Article VI.

ARTICLE V.

TERMINATION

- 5.1 This Agreement shall terminate upon the occurrence of any of the following:
- a) The Fire Districts may terminate this Agreement if The Communications District defaults on any obligation set out herein, and the Fire Districts shall be entitled to a refund of 1/365 of the annual fee for each day remaining on the term of the agreement.
- b) The Communications District may terminate this Agreement as to all Fire Districts if any of The Fire Districts default on any obligation set out herein, unless the remaining Fire Districts agree to pay the annual fee of the defaulting Fire District(s). Alternatively, upon default of any one certain district, fire dispatch services for that district may be discontinued, and all calls for service will be routed via seven (7) digit telephone lines to that district's administrative line.
 - c) This agreement shall terminate if all parties mutually agree, in writing.

ARTICLE VI.

PLEDGE OF COOPERATION

6.1 The parties hereto pledge their mutual cooperation in complying with the terms of the Agreement, all to the end that the health and welfare of the residents of Terrebonne Parish shall be promoted and that the needs of said residents for emergency telephone response may be satisfactorily met.

ARTICLE VII.

SEVERABILITY

7.1 In the event any one or more provisions of this Agreement is for any reason held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provision hereof, but the Agreement shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provisions had never been contained in this agreement. In the event that legislation enacted after the date of this Agreement validates or makes legal any provisions hereof, said legislation shall be deemed to apply hereto.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this agreement to be executed in multiple counterparts, and by the parties hereto on separate counterparts, each of which shall be deemed as an original, all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES BETWEEN TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT AND SOUTHEAST LOUISIANA LEGAL SERVICES

This agreement is entered into on the dates set forth herein by and between:

TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT, a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, herein represented by Gordon Dove, President of Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, ("TPCG"), and

SOUTHEAST LOUISIANA LEGAL SERVICES, a non-profit corporation duly constituted under the laws of the State of Louisiana, authorized to do and doing business in the Parish of Terrebonne, State of Louisiana, herein represented by its duly authorized Executive Director, and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 14 of the Louisiana Constitution authorizes the use of public funds and property "for programs of social welfare for the aid and support of the needy;" and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 14 of the Louisiana Constitution further provides that "For a public purpose, the state and its political subdivisions or political corporations may engage in cooperative endeavors with each other, with the United States or its agencies, or with any public or private association, corporation or individual," and

WHEREAS, the mission of SOUTHEAST LOUISIANA LEGAL SERVICES is to provide legal counseling and representation to low-income individuals in Terrebonne Parish free of charge; and

WHEREAS, the provision of legal services by Southeast Louisiana Legal Services is determined on a case-by-case basis according to objective criteria to insure that services are only being provided to the truly needy; and

WHEREAS, TPCG believes that partially funding the services of Southeast Louisiana Legal Services will serve the public purpose of making our legal system accessible to low-income and elderly citizens in Terrebonne Parish; and

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

Purpose

The purpose of this cooperative agreement between TPCG and Southeast Louisiana Legal Services is partially funding the services of Southeast Louisiana Legal Services will serve the public purpose of making our legal system accessible to low-income and elderly citizens in Terrebonne Parish by the Southeast Louisiana Legal Services.

Terms

- Southeast Louisiana Legal Services will provide legal counseling and representation to qualifying low-income individuals in Terrebonne Parish free of charge.
- Southeast Louisiana Legal Services will require that all individuals receiving free legal services must meet objective criteria to insure that the individual is truly needy.
- 3. In consideration for the performance of the services specified in this Cooperative Endeavor, and upon providing adequately documented requests for reimbursement, TPCG agrees to remit up to Thirty Thousand Dollars and NO/100 (\$30,000).
- 4. During the term of this agreement, the remittance by TPCG to Southeast Louisiana Legal Services shall be allotted in the following amount and for the following purpose:
 - a. Up to Thirty Thousand Dollars and NO/100 (\$30,000) to pay the rent, utilities, and other office operating costs including janitorial service and office supplies for their office in Terrebonne Parish located at 521 Roussell Street, Houma, Louisiana 70360.
- 5. For work performed under the terms and conditions of this Agreement, Southeast Louisiana Legal Services may submit to the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, Accounting Division, copies of cancelled checks for their Terrebonne Parish Office to receive reimbursement.
- 6. In order to receive reimbursement for travel expenses, at the end of the contract term, Southeast Louisiana Legal Services must submit a report detailing travel expenses; destination and purpose of travel; names of employees incurring the expense; and the client being served by the travel.
- 7. This contract embodies the complete agreement of the parties superceding all oral or written previous or contemporary agreements between the parties relating to matters in this Agreement.

Term

This agreement shall begin on <u>January 1, 2022</u> and shall terminate on <u>December 31, 2022</u>.

Non-appropriation

Notwithstanding any provisions herein, in the event sufficient funds for the performance of this contract for professional services are not appropriated by the governing authority of the TPCG in any fiscal year covered by this contract, this agreement may be terminated by the TPCG giving notice to Southeast Louisiana Legal Services of such facts and the Parish's intention to terminate its financial obligation.

Compliance with Laws

The parties hereto and their employees, contractors and agents shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and ordinances in carrying out the provisions of this agreement.

Choice of Law

This agreement shall be governed by Louisiana law and the provisions of this agreement shall be enforced and brought in the Thirty-second Judicial District Court, Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana.

Legal Construction

In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provisions thereof and this agreement shall be considered as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained in this agreement.

Amendment

No amendment to this agreement shall be effective unless it is in writing, signed by the duly authorized representatives of both parties.

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 14 of the Louisiana Constitution further provides that "For a public purpose, the state and its political subdivisions or political corporations may engage in cooperative endeavors with each other, with the United States or its agencies, or with any public or private association, corporation or individual"; and,

WHEREAS, Louisiana Constitution Article VI, Section 20, Louisiana Revised Statutes 33:1324 and Section 1-07 of the Terrebonne Parish Charter provides "the parish government is authorized, as provided by state law, to enter into joint service agreements or cooperative efforts with other governmental agencies and political subdivisions"; and,

WHEREAS, TPCG believes that supporting the "GCSS Houma Senior Center in the Mechanicville Memorial Community center" will serve a public purpose and is not gratuitous in light if the benefit provided for support of the poor pursuant to Louisiana Revised Statute 33:1236(11) & 33:4563; and,

WHEREAS, Gulf Coast is a Louisiana Non-Profit Corporation organized in accordance with Louisiana law;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Terrebonne Parish Council (Budget and Finance Committee), on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, hereby authorizes the Parish President to enter into a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement pending legal approving proposed agreement.

COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT BETWEEN TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT AND GULF COAST TEACHING FAMILY SERVICES

ARTICLE I.

This Cooperative Endeavor Agreement ("Agreement") has been entered into on the dates set forth herein by and between:

TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT, (herein sometimes referred to as "**TPCG**"), address 8026 Main Street, a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, herein represented by Gordon E. Dove, President of Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government; and

GULF COAST TEACHING FAMILY SERVICES (herein sometimes referred to as "**Gulf Coast**"), a Non-Profit Corporation of the State of Louisiana, in good standing, whose address is 2400 Edenborn Avenue, Metairie, LA 70001, herein represented by its duly authorized signatory, per certificate authority Willie Green, President.

who, in order to serve the public for the purposes hereinafter stated, declared and acknowledged, as follows:

- 1.1 WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 14 of the Louisiana Constitution further provides that "For a public purpose, the state and its political subdivisions or political corporations may engage in cooperative endeavors with each other, with the United States or its agencies, or with any public or private association, corporation or individual"; and,
- 1.2 WHEREAS, Section 1-05. of the Terrebonne Parish Charter in its pertinent part provides that "The parish government shall have and exercise such other powers, rights, privileges, immunities, authority and functions not inconsistent with this charter as may be conferred on or granted to a local governmental subdivision by the constitution and general laws of the state, and more specifically, the parish government shall have and is hereby granted the right and authority to exercise any power and perform any function necessary, requisite or proper for the management of its affairs, not denied by this charter, or by general law, or inconsistent with the constitution" and furthermore, Louisiana Constitution Article VI, Section 20, Louisiana Revised Statutes 33:1324 and Section 1-07 of the Terrebonne Parish Charter provides "the parish government is authorized, as provided by state law, to enter into joint service agreements or cooperative efforts with other governmental agencies and political subdivisions"; and,
- 1.3 WHEREAS, TPCG has the authority, pursuant to the Constitution of the State of Louisiana to support programs of social welfare for the aid of the elderly for recreation as determined through objective criteria; and
- 1.4 WHEREAS, TPCG finds that its expenditure according to the terms of this cooperative endeavor, taken as a whole is not gratuitous, has a public purpose, and that it has a demonstrable, objective, and reasonable expectation of receiving at least equivalent value in exchange for the expenditure of public funds;
- 1.5 WHEREAS, Gulf Coast is a Louisiana Non-Profit Corporation organized in accordance with Louisiana law;
- 1.6 NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government and Gulf Coast, each represented by the undersigned, duly authorized to act herein respectively, agree to the following:

ARTICLE II. PURPOSE

2.1 The purpose of this Agreement between Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government and Gulf Coast is for the purpose of providing and administrating services at the Houma Senior Center in the Mechanicville Memorial Community Center. The parties agree that these services are for a public purpose that will provide Terrebonne Parish senior citizens with recreational activities. TPCG has received a budget from Gulf Coast, objectively, has a reasonable expectation of

receiving equivalent value for the services rendered, and payment for Gulf Coast's services are not gratuitous.

ARTICLE III. SCOPE SERVICES

- 3.1.1 TPCG shall pay up to One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) to Gulf Coast for the administration of the senior citizens recreational activities. The purpose is to provide forty to fifty seniors daily by offering a variety of activities, educational seminars, daily meals, and light snacks. Certain participants must be 60 years of age or older, Terrebonne Parish residents and meet other program criteria. Transportation will only be provided for scheduled community outings.
- 3.2 Parties agree that Gulf Coast shall be responsible for the administration at the "Houma Senior Center" to operate and maintain the program for the elderly.
- 3.3 Gulf Coast agrees it shall incur costs administrating the program prior to TPCG reimbursement for up to the agreed amount. Gulf Coast shall provide adequate documents, accounting of records and receipts that the money used has been used for offering daily variety of activities, education seminars, daily meals, and light snack to elderly residents of Terrebonne Parish. Gulf Coast shall submit to any audit request of TPCG and cooperate with any auditor or auditors selected.
- 3.4 Gulf Coast agrees its employees, volunteers, servants, contractors/ subcontractors are the sole responsibility of Gulf Coast and TPCG is not responsible for these individuals. Gulf Coast is solely responsible for payment of wages and taxes.
- 3.5 Gulf Coast agrees that it shall retain necessary insurance coverage to conduct senior activities such as Workers Compensation, Employment Government Liability Practices, and General Liability, Auto Liability.
- 3.6 Gulf Coast agrees TPCG is not responsible for the facility or payment benefits where activities are conducted, and Gulf Coast shall ensure these facilities are appropriate and adequate to conduct these programs in a safe manner.
- 3.7 Gulf Coast will provide service Monday- Friday 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

ARTICLE IV. TERM

4.1 The term of this Agreement is from January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022.

ARTICLE V. TERMINATION

- 5.1 This Agreement shall be terminated under any or all of the following conditions:
 - 5.1.1 By written mutual agreement and consent of the parties hereto.
 - 5.1.2 For convenience by TPCG: By thirty (30) days written notice by TPCG to Gulf Coast.
 - 5.1.3 For cause: By either party as a consequence of the failure of the other party to comply with the terms and conditions of this Agreement in a satisfactory manner, proper allowance being made for circumstances beyond the control of the parties.
 - 5.1.4 As set forth in Article XVI.

ARTICLE VI. INSURANCE

- 6.1 The Gulf Coast shall procure and maintain the following insurance:
- 6.2 MINIMUM LIMITS OF INSURANCE:

All parties shall maintain limits no less than:

6.2.1 General Liability:

- 6.2.1.1 Commercial General Liability Form CG 00 01, or pre-approved equivalent; Minimal acceptable limit: \$1,000,000 per occurrence; \$2,000,000 general aggregate that also includes lessee coverage if applicable; \$2,000,000 products/completed operations aggregate; including \$1,000,000 per occurrence in Sexual Abuse and Molestation Liability;
- 6.2.1.2 Additional Insured endorsement in favor of TPCG, its elected and appointed officials, agents, directors, servants, employees and volunteers on CG 2010 Form B (edition 0704), or approved equivalent; and
- 6.2.1.3 Waiver of Transfer of Rights of Recovery Against Others to in favor of TPCG, its elected and appointed officials, agents, directors, servants, employees, and volunteers.
- 6.3 Automobile Liability: \$500,000 combined single limit per accident, for bodily injury and property damage, including Hired/Non-Owned Auto Liability.
- Worker's Compensation Insurance to the meet the applicable statutory requirements and Employers' Liability insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 and shall include:
 - 6.4.1 Alternate Employer Endorsement
 - 6.4.2 Voluntary Compensation Endorsement
- 6.5 Employment Practices and Directors/Officers. Gulf Coast shall have a broad form employment practices that will include governmental liability at minimum coverage of \$1,000,000.
- 6.6 Umbrella and/or Excess Policy. Gulf Coast will maintain an umbrella and/or excess coverage of combined single limit of \$4,000,000.

6.7 OTHER INSURANCE PROVISIONS

The policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

- 6.7.1 TPCG is to be added as "additional insured" as respects liability arising out of activities performed by or on behalf of the insuring party; products and completed operations of the insuring party, vehicles owned, occupied or used by the insuring party. It is understood that the business auto policy under "Who is insured" automatically provides liability coverage in favor of each party named as an "additional insured."
- 6.7.2 Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policy shall not affect coverage provided to each receiving party.
- 6.7.3 The receiving party's insurance shall apply separately to each insured against whom claim is made or suit is brought, except with respect to the limits of the insurer's liability.
- 6.7.4 All policies of insurance shall, where applicable, favor all receiving parties with a waiver of subrogation.

6.8 WORKERS' COMPENSATION AND EMPLOYERS LIABILITY COVERAGE

6.8.1 The GCSS and its insurer shall agree to waive all rights of subrogation against each "additional insured" party, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers for losses arising from work performed by the insuring party for each "additional insured" party.

6.9 ALL COVERAGES

6.9.1 Each insurance policy required by this article shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be suspended, voided, cancelled by any party, or reduced in coverage or in limits

except after thirty (30) days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to each Party listed as "additional insured."

- 6.9.2 All policies above endorsed to be primary coverage to any other coverage.
- 6.9.3 Coverages should be endorsed to cover proper "territory" of operations.

6.10 ACCEPTABILITY OF INSURERS

6.10.1 Insurance is to be placed with insurers authorized in Louisiana, with a Best's rating of no less than A-VI.

6. 11 VERIFICATION OF COVERAGE

6.11.1 Gulf Coast shall furnish to TPCG certificates of insurance effecting coverage required by this article. The certificates for each insurance policy are to be signed by a person authorized by that insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. The certificates are to be received and approved by TPCG before Gulf Coast use commences. TPCG reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required policies, at any time.

ARTICLE VII. INDEMNIFICATION

To the fullest extent permitted by law Gulf Coast shall protect, defend, indemnify, save and hold harmless the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government from and against any and all claims, demands, expense, losses, suits, costs, actions, fines, penalties, and liability, whether actual or alleged, arising out of or resulting from injury, sickness, asbestos, lead, hazardous materials, disease or death to any person or the damage, loss, expense or destruction of any property, including loss of use resulting there from, which may occur, be caused by, or in any way result from any damages sustained by a Gulf Coast participant while in the course and scope of his or her duties under the employment of TPCG, or which may occur, be caused by, or in any way result from any actual or alleged act, omission, negligence, misconduct, or strict liability of Gulf Coast, its agents, contractors, sub-contractors, partners, affiliates, directors, officers, employees, servants, volunteers, anyone directly or indirectly employed by it, or anyone for whose acts it may be liable, including but not limited to acts related to the performance or non-performance of the Agreement herein entered into, including any and all costs, fines, damages (special, general, or punitive) penalties, expense and/or attorney fees, including but not limited to expert witness fees, incurred by the TPCG as a result of any such claims, demands, losses and/or causes of action including any costs associated with the enforcement of this indemnity provision except those arising out of the sole negligence of TPCG. This indemnification does not apply to any strict liability of the TPCG. Gulf Coast shall investigate, adjust, settle, contest to resolution, resist claims, handle, respond to, provide defense for and defend any such claims, demands, proceedings, judgments, or suits at its sole expense related thereto, even if such claim, proceeding, judgment, demand or suit is groundless, false or fraudulent. TPCG shall not waive any immunity to which it is entitled under law.

ARTICLE VIII. NO WAIVER

8.1 The failure of the either party to enforce any of the terms of this Agreement or to provide any of the supporting documentation in any particular instance shall not constitute a waiver of, or preclude the subsequent enforcement of, any or all of the terms or conditions of this Agreement.

ARTICLE IX. COVENANT AGAINST CONTINGENT FEES

9.1 Gulf Coast warrants that it has not employed or retained any entity or person to solicit or secure this Agreement, and that it has not paid or agreed to pay any entity or person any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or any other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the making of this Agreement. For breach or violation of this warranty, the TPCG shall have the right to annul this Agreement without liability or, in TPCG's discretion, to deduct from the contract price or consideration, or otherwise recover the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or contingent fee.

ARTICLE X. ENTIRE AGREEMENT/AMENDMENT

- 10.1 This Agreement, including any attachments that are expressly referred to in this Agreement, contains the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any and all agreements or contracts previously entered into between the parties. No representations were made or relied upon by either party, other than those that are expressly set forth. This Agreement may be modified or amended at any time by mutual consent of the parties, provided that, before any modification or amendment shall be operative and valid, it shall be reduced to writing and signed by both parties.
- 10.2 The recitation and preambles of this agreement are hereby made a part of this agreement.

ARTICLE XI. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

11.1 The parties hereto and their employees, contractors, and agents shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and ordinances in carrying out the provisions of this agreement. Gulf Coast acknowledges by accepting government funds it is subject to public records laws, legislative audits, and public laws as it relates to use of government funds.

ARTICLE XII. CHOICE OF LAW AND VENUE

12.1 To the fullest extent allowed by law, this Agreement shall be governed and interpreted by Louisiana Law and the provisions of this agreement shall be enforced and brought in the Thirty Second Judicial District Court, Terrebonne Parish, Louisiana.

ARTICLE XIII. SEVERABILITY

13.1 In case anyone or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provisions thereof and this agreement shall be considered as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained in this agreement.

ARTICLE XIV. FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE

14.1 TPCG may be audited in accordance with La. R.S. 24:513. If the amount of public funds received by the Gulf Coast is below the amount for which an audit is required under La. RS. 24:513, the TPCG shall monitor and evaluate the use of the funds to ensure effective achievement of the project goals and objectives.

ARTICLE XV. AUDIT CLAUSE

- 15.1 It is hereby agreed that the Legislative Auditor of the State of Louisiana, and/or the Office of the Governor, Division of Administration auditors shall have the option of inspecting and auditing all data, records and accounts of the Gulf Coast which relate to this Agreement, upon request.
- 15.2 TPCG and Gulf Coast agree that TPCG can audit any documents/records of any nature related to this agreement at TPCG's expense, and/or its representative, Gulf Coast shall produce the documents. Gulf Coast shall not destroy any documents/records without prior approval of TPCG. The production of documents/records shall be within seventy-two (72) hours of the request.

ARTICLE XVI. FISCAL FUNDING (NON-APPROPROATION)

16.1 In the event funds are not budgeted or appropriated in any fiscal year for payments due under this Agreement for the then current or succeeding fiscal year, this Agreement shall impose no obligation on the TPCG or the Gulf Coast as to such current or succeeding fiscal year, and said Agreement shall become null and void, and no right of action shall accrue to the benefit of the Gulf Coast or TPCG, their successors or assigns for any further payments.

ARTICLE XVII. DISCRIMINATION CLAUSE

17.1 Gulf Coast agrees to abide by the requirements of the following as applicable: Title VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended by the Equal Opportunity Act of 1972, Federal Executive Order 11246, the Federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, the Vietnam Era Veteran's Readjustment Assistance Act of 1974, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended, the Age Act of 1975, as amended, and Gulf Coast agrees to abide by the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended. Gulf Coast agrees not to discriminate in its employment practices and will render services under this contract without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, veteran status, political affiliation, or disabilities. Gulf Coast acknowledges and agrees that any act of unlawful discrimination committed by Gulf Coast, or any other failure to comply with these statutory obligations when applicable shall be grounds for termination of this Agreement.

ARTICLE XVIII. LEGAL COMPLIANCE

18.1 The TPCG shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws and regulations, including, specifically, the Louisiana Code of Governmental Ethics (R.S. 42: 110 I, *et seq.*) in carrying out the provisions of this Agreement.

ARTICLE XIX. FORCE MAJEURE

19.1 Neither party to this Agreement shall be responsible to the other party hereto for any delays or failure to perform caused by any circumstances reasonably beyond the immediate control of the party prevented from performing, including, but not limited to, acts of God.

ARTICLE XX. EMPLOYMENT OF TPCG PERSONNEL

20.1 Gulf Coast certifies that it has not employed and will not employ any person to engage in the performance of this Agreement who is presently, or at tile time of such employment, an employee of the TPCG.

ARTICLE XXI. SURVIVAL

21.1 Any provisions of this Agreement which by its nature, such as indemnification and insurance coverage, is intended to survive the termination or completion of this Agreement will survive the termination or completion of the Agreement.

ARTICLE XXII. NOTICES

- 22.1 All notices and other communications pertaining to tills Agreement shall be in writing and shall be transmitted either by personal hand-delivery (and receipted for) or deposited in the United States mail, as certified mail, return receipt requested and postage prepaid, to the other party addressed as follows:

ARTICLE XXIII. INDEPENDENT CONTRACT

23.1 Gulf Coast is an independent contractor, providing goods and services to third parties on a contractual basis. Nothing contained herein shall make Gulf Coast an agent, associate, joint venture partner or representative of TPCG.

ARTICLE XXIV. NO WAIVER

24.1 The failure of TPCG and Gulf Coast to enforce any of the terms of this Agreement or to provide any of the supporting documentation in any particular instance shall not constitute a waiver of, or preclude the subsequent enforcement of, any or all of the terms or conditions of this Agreement or of any of the supporting documentation.

ARTICLE XXV. AMENDMENT

25.1 No amendment to this Agreement shall be effective unless it is in writing, signed by the duly authorized representatives of both parties.

ARTICLE XXVI. ASSIGNMENT

26.1 No party shall assign, in whole or in part, the rights and obligations under this Agreement in any manner except by operation of law or by the consent of the non-assigning party obtained beforehand in writing, and in case of such assignment so consented to, all of the conditions and provisions herein shall apply to such substituted party.

ARTICLE XXVII. NON-APPROPRIATION

27. Notwithstanding any provisions herein, in the event sufficient funds for the performance of this Agreement are not appropriated by the governing authority of TPCG in any fiscal year covered by this contract, this Agreement may be terminated by TPCG giving notice to Gulf Coast of such facts and the Parish's intention to terminate its financial obligation.

ARTICLE XXVIII. COUNTERPARTS

28. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which, taken together, shall constitute one and the same agreement. A signed copy of this Agreement transmitted by facsimile, email or other means of electronic transmission shall be deemed to have the same legal effect as delivery of an original executed copy of this Agreement.

ARTICLE XXIX. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

29. This Agreement, including its attachments and its preambles, and any applicable state and federal laws pertinent hereto, comprises the complete and exclusive statement of the agreement of the Parties concerning the subject matter hereof, and supersedes all previous statements, representations, and agreements concerning the subject matter hereof.


