is in a dilapidated and dangerous condition that endangers the health, safety and welfare of the public; accordingly, the structure is hereby condemned, and the owner is hereby ordered to repair, demolish and/or remove the structure by July 31, 2024; in default of which, the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government may proceed to do so, and, in accordance therewith, the Parish Administration be authorized to proceed with the bidding process for the demolition and/or removal."


Nuisance Abatement Code Enforcement Officer II Camilla Brown presented the historical background on the residential & accessory structure located at 531 Roanoke Street, Houma, LA, owned by William Martin Jeff, Charlene Jeff Washington, Gwen Jeff Banks, Janet Jeff Johnson, Michael G. Jeff, & Malika Jeff, noting the following:

- The initial complaint was received on September 20, 2023, and the initial inspection was completed on September 21, 2023.
- The initial inspection indicated this structure was, in fact, in such condition to be formally declared as dilapidated and dangerous, rendering it hazardous to the overall health, safety, and welfare to the general public and causing a blight problem, with the following conditions present:
 - The structure appeared to be abandoned.
 - It has not been maintained in a clean, safe, secure, and sanitary condition.
 - \circ It has not been maintained free from weeds in excess of 12 inches.
 - It may be a place of rodent harborage.
 - The exterior has not been maintained in good repair, sanitary condition.
 - The roof and flashing have not been maintained in a sound, tight condition
 - that would prevent the admittance of rain and/or dampness.
 - Windows and/or doors have not been maintained in sound condition, good repair, and weather tight.
 - The interior has not been maintained in a good, clean, and sanitary condition.
- The Notice of Violation was issued on October 9, 2023 and received on October 18, 2023.

Mrs. Brown stated that, as of an inspection completed on April 19, 2024, this structure remains in violation and that Administration recommends this structure be condemned.

The Chairman recognized Mrs. Janet Johnson, representing the property owner, who shared their intentions to demolish the property.

PROJECT TITLE

A Resolution to introduce proposed revisions to Chapter 6, Appendix A, Part II of the Parish Code of Ordinances to rescind Parish Ordinance No. 9015 relative to waiving certain types of residential building permit fees and call for a public hearing on said matter on Wednesday, August 28, 2024 at 6:30 p.m.

PROJECT SUMMARY (200 WORDS OR LESS)

In Nov 2018, Council passed Ordinance No. 9015 which waived permit fees for certain residential permits such as: roofs, renovations, detached accessory structures, fences, swimming pools except in the event of work being performed without a permit where the fees would be applied and doubled as per the penalty. This proposed ordinance would reinstate the fees as they were prior to Nov 2018. This is not an increase in the fee amounts. <u>This does not change permit requirements – permits are still required as they have always been</u>. Since this ordinance is related to fees, it requires a 30 day holdover for the public hearing.

PROJECT PURPOSE & BENEFITS (150 WORDS OR LESS)

Hurricane Ida struck Terrebonne Parish on August 29, 2021 and will go down as one of the worst hurricanes in our area's history. Since that time, the Permit Office has issued over 20,700 permits at a rate of more than double the annual pre-storm average. This increase in construction and repair activity (both by locals and State's Restore LA Program) coupled with the increase in volume of phone calls and related hurricane recovery activity have overburdened the Permit Office staff and resulted in longer permit issuance times. These fees which go into the Parish General Fund will allow for the hiring of additional staff to help with the increased volume and ultimately serve to expedite permit issuance in the years beyond Ida recovery.

SUBJECT: Rescinding Ord. No. 9015 - Waiving of Certain Residential Building Permit Fees

The Parish Permit Office has issued over 20,700 permits since Hurricane Ida at a rate that is more than double the pre-storm annual average without an increase in staff. We are three years out and the pace continues. To look at alternative ways to fund positions, we discussed the reinstatement of certain residential permit fees which would then be redirected to help fund additional staff in the form of a third Permit Clerk. This pertains to certain types of **residential** projects such as:

- fences
- roofs
- swimming pools
- siding
- driveways (addition, replacement, or repair)
- shutters/awnings
- kitchen remodels
- bath upgrades or remodels
- window and/or door replacements
- insulation
- flooring
- patio cover (not patio enclosure)
- soffits
- veneer/façade
- shoring/leveling (not elevation)
- renovations or repairs
- placement or construction of sheds, storage buildings, and detached garages
- other residential renovation projects

This is a reinstatement of fees – not a fee increase. The fees have remained in place since 2018 and were applied when/if a penalty for work without a permit was incurred. Permits are still required as always.

SECTION 109 FEES

109.1 Payment of Fees. Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the contrary, the jurisdiction shall maintain authority to determine the amount of any permit fee(s) charged to applicants in accordance with this Section. A permit shall not be valid until the fees prescribed by law have been paid, nor shall an amendment to a permit be released until the additional fee, if any, has been paid. Fees shall not be discounted for any cause except as specifically provided for in this code.

109.2 Schedule of Permit Fees. On buildings, structures, electrical, gas, mechanical, and plumbing systems or alterations requiring a permit, a fee for each permit shall be paid as required, in accordance with the tables in this Chapter.

109.2.1 Payment required. A building permit shall not be issued, nor shall the application for a building permit be accepted, until the fees prescribed in this section shall have been paid. Nor shall an amendment to a permit application be approved until the additional fee, if any, due to an increase in the estimated cost of the building or structure shall have been paid. A certificate of occupancy shall not be issued, nor shall the certificate of occupancy, compliance or completion application be accepted, until the fees prescribed in this section shall have been paid.

109.2.2 Level of fees. The required fees shall be determined by reference to Tables 109.2.2(1) through 109.2.2(4) below, except for certain residential permit fee types as noted in Section 109.2.2.1 below. Acceptance of the permit application by the jurisdiction shall not constitute consent to the commencement of work; and commencement of work prior to the issuance and display of a permit shall result in additional fees being due in accordance with Section 109.4 (below).

Section 109.2.2.1 Waiver of certain residential building permit fees. Beginning January 1, 2019, permit application fees for the following residential permit types will be waived. This waiver of fees does not preclude the requirement for obtaining a permit as described in Section 105 above.

Detached accessory structure — with 1 or more walls.

Detached accessory structure not exceeding 500 square feet and without walls.

Detached accessory structure greater than 500 square feet and without walls.

Attached patio cover (aluminum).

Renovation or repair (cost up to \$5,000).

Renovation or repair (cost \$5,001 to \$10,000).

Renovation or repair (cost over \$10,000).

Private swimming pool.

Structure shoring or leveling.

Extension of permit (only before expiry date).

However, if any work is started before the necessary permits have been issued and displayed, all permit fees shall not be waived and penalties shall be assessed as per Section 109.4.

109.2.3 Third party service providers. Parish may grant a permit fee discount to applicants who have contracted with a qualified third party provider for plan reviews and inspections as required by the Louisiana Uniform Construction Code and other state or local laws which have been or may be adopted, said discount to be no greater than 40% of the standard permit fee that would otherwise be charged the applicant. In the instance that a third party provider is used for plan review only, there shall be no discount. In the instance

that the third party provider is used for inspections only, the discount shall be no greater than 30% of the standard permit fee.

109.2.4 Amendment of fees. The nature and level of fees specified in Section 109.2.2.1 and Tables 109.2.2(1), (2), (3) and (4) may be amended by ordinance of the Council of the jurisdiction.

109.2.5 Accessory Structure Defined. A detached structure, without finished interior, plumbing, mechanical, or gas installation, and restricted to use for storage or parking incidental to a primary building located on the same lot. An Accessory Structure shall not constitute or be converted to living, working, or recreational space except under the authority of a new construction permit. Any accessory structure not meeting this definition shall be charged as new construction.

109.3 Discounted Fees. For a period not exceeding ninety (90) days from the date of any federal, state, or local disaster declaration, the jurisdiction may waive or discount permit fees for the immediate repair, renovation, reconstruction, elevation, or demolition of any residential structure affected by such disaster, in which case any reduction in normal fees for enforcement agency services shall be made good from the jurisdiction's general fund.

109.4 Work Commencing Before Permit Issuance. Where any work is started in relation to a building, structure, electrical, gas, mechanical or plumbing system before the necessary permits have been issued and displayed, all permit fees in respect of work to be undertaken on that building, structure, electrical, gas, mechanical or plumbing system shall be doubled, and assessed in addition to any other violation penalties.

109.5 Related Fees. Payment of the fee for the construction, alteration, removal or demolition for work done in connection to or concurrently with the work authorized by a building permit shall not relieve the applicant or holder of the permit from the payment of other lawfully prescribed fees.

109.6 Refunds. The jurisdiction is authorized to establish a refund policy.

109.7 Multiple Contractors. Where, for whatever reason, contractors are responsible for specific segments of a contract, the permit(s) issued shall clearly identify the limits of that contractor's task. Where there is a change of contractor partway through any construction project, new permit fees shall be based on the value of the balance of work to be completed and no refund shall be made for prior permits.

109.8 Building Permit Valuations. Job cost valuations shall include the total value of all services, materials and labor costs, for the full project scope covered by the permit. Any change or increase in project scope or value shall require additional permitting.

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE PARISH PRESIDENT TO EXECUTE A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT AND PETROLEUM HELICOPTERS INTERNATIONAL INCORPORATED AND TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS.

SECTION I

WHEREAS, Section 1 - 06 of the Home Rule Charter for the Parish of Terrebonne provides that the parish government shall have the right, power and authority to pass all ordinances requisite or necessary to promote, protect, and preserve the general welfare, safety, health, peace and good order of the parish, including, but not by way of limitation, the right, power and authority to pass ordinances on all subject matter necessary, requisite or proper for the management of the parish affairs, and all other subject matter without exception, subject only to the limitations that the same shall not be inconsistent with the Constitution or expressly denied by the general law applicable to the parish; and

WHEREAS, Petroleum Helicopters International, Inc. ("PHI") and Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government ("TPCG") strive to coordinate their disaster response efforts in preparing for, responding to, and recovering from major incidents including natural and manmade disasters of significant proportion; and

WHEREAS, TPCG wishes to provide PHI use of the parking garage owned by TPCG during events declared as an emergency by TPCG's Parish President, specifically for PHI pilots to park their personal vehicles when the parish is under evacuation orders; and

WHEREAS, PHI will provide Terrebonne Parish with support for its emergency operations, including energy providers and hospitals; and

SECTION II

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT AND PETROLEUM HELICOPTERS INTERNATIONAL, INC.

I. PARTIES

- 1.1 **Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government ("TPCG")**, a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, acting by and through its President, Jason W. Bergeron, by authority of Ordinance Number_____; and
- 1.2 **Petroleum Helicopters International, Inc.** ("PHI"), (EIN ______), a business registered to do business in Louisiana, who delivers high quality support for energy providers, hospitals, air medical organizations, and government entities by use of its air transport.

II. TERM

2.1 This **Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU")** shall be effective upon the date of final signature and shall remain in effect for ten years.

III. PURPOSE

- 3.1 PHI and TPCG strive to coordinate their disaster response efforts in preparing for, responding to, and recovering from major incidents including natural and manmade disasters of significant proportion.
- 3.2 The primary goals of this MOU include:
 - a. To provide PHI use of the parking garage owned by TPCG during events declared as an emergency by TPCG's Parish President, specifically for PHI pilots to park their personal vehicles when the parish is under evacuation orders.
 - b. To provide Terrebonne Parish with support for its emergency operations, including energy providers and hospitals with the assistance of PHI.
- 3.3 TPCG agrees to allow PHI pilots to use its designated parking garage located at 8026 Main Street, Houma, LA, 70360, during officially declared emergencies.
 - 3.3.1 PHI may use the parking garage solely for the purpose of providing secure parking for its pilots' personal vehicles during such emergencies.
 - 3.3.2 PHI will provide TPCG with a list of authorized personnel who may access the parking garage during emergencies
 - 3.3.3 PHI will ensure that its personnel follow all posted rules and regulations within the parking garage.
- 3.4 This agreement does not guarantee availability of parking spaces and is subject to space limitations and other emergency uses of the facility as determined by TPCG.

IV. CONFIDENTIALITY

4.1 Both during and after the term of this MOU, the parties will keep, and will ensure that their respective employees, volunteers, contractors, and agents keep, confidential all materials and information provided by the other party in relation to this MOU that are not available to the general public.

V. NONBINDING NATURE OF MOU; NONPARTNERSHIP

5.1 This MOU is not binding or legally enforceable and does not impose any enforceable obligations upon the parties.

5.2 This MOU does not constitute and shall not be construed as constituting any of the relationships of agency, partnership, or joint venture between the parties. Neither party shall have the right to bind the other party in any manner whatsoever. The parties are separate and independent organizations. Each is responsible for establishing its own policies and financing its own activities.

VI. OTHER NECESSARY CLAUSES

- 6.1 Each party shall designate a point of contact for communication regarding this MOU.
- 6.2 Either party may terminate this MOU for any reason upon thirty (30) day written notice to the point of contact designated by the other party.
- 6.3 Both parties will use their best efforts to meet their roles and responsibilities as outlined in this MOU, which are aspirational goals and are not binding contractual promises. In all circumstances, each party is responsible for the safety and well-being of its employees, representatives, responders, contractors, volunteers, and agents.
- 6.4 Each party acknowledges that there are risks associated with participating in disaster response activities and assumes those risks knowingly on behalf of its employees, representatives, responders, contractors, volunteers, and agents.
- 6.5 This MOU may be modified or amended by mutual agreement of both parties in writing
- 6.6 PHI shall be responsible for its actions or omissions and those of its employees.
- 6.7 PHI shall show proof of insurance for all vehicles being stored in the TPCG parking garage.
- 6.8 PHI agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend TPCG and its officers, employees, and agents from and against any claims, damages, losses, and expenses arising out of or resulting from PHI's use of the parking garage under this MOU, except to the extent caused by the willful misconduct of TPCG.

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THE FOLLOWING PROPERTY ADJUDICATED TO TERREBONNE PARISH CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT AS SURPLUS AND NOT NEEDED FOR A PUBLIC PURPOSE; **1601 BAYOU DULARGE ROAD, PARCEL NO 41383 (4.1667%);** AND TO ADDRESS OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE THERETO.

WHEREAS, a percentage of immovable property was adjudicated to the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government for nonpayment of taxes; and

WHEREAS, LA R.S. 47:2196, *et seq.* authorizes the parish to sell adjudicated property in accordance with law; and

WHEREAS, the three (3) year period for redemption provided by Art. 7, §25 of the Louisiana Constitution has elapsed without redemption; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, that Administration be hereby authorized to dispose of the property in accordance with LA R.S. 47:2196, *et seq.* and inclusive of the following terms

SECTION I

Each bid shall be accompanied by a deposit in the form of a Certified Check, Cashier's Check, Money Order or Bid Bond with Power of Attorney (Letters of Credit WILL NOT be accepted) in the amount of twenty percent (20%) of the proposed price made payable to the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government. Bid deposits made for non-winning bids shall be returned. The bid deposit made with the winning bid shall be non-refundable, unless redemption occurs, and paid towards the purchase price. The balance of the purchase price is due at the time of closing and payable in the form of a Certified Check, Cashier's Check, or Money Order.

SECTION II

Additionally, the winning bidder shall bear the cost of recording the sale document into the conveyance records of the Parish of Terrebonne pursuant to La. R.S. 47:2207.

SECTION III

The winning bidder, otherwise known as the Purchaser or Acquirer, of this adjudicated property is solely responsible for compliance with La. R.S. 47:2206 regarding notification of parties who may have had an interest in the property regarding their rights of redemption and La. R.S. 47:2208 regarding recordation of those notices. Copies of the applicable law will be distributed along with bid packets for this adjudicated property. Terrebonne Parish Consolidated

Government has not and will not perform these requirements; thus, it is the purchaser's or acquiring person's responsibility to do so. Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government encourages the Purchaser or Acquiring Person to consult legal counsel regarding Louisiana law on adjudicated property.

SECTION IV

The winning bidder, otherwise known as the Purchaser, of this adjudicated property acknowledges that the property must be maintained and kept up in a clean and sanitary condition, free of blight, and in full compliance with all applicable laws and ordinances, both state and local, including, but not limited to, all provisions in Terrebonne Parish Code of Ordinances Chapter 14, which governs nuisances in Terrebonne Parish. In the event that the winning bidder, otherwise known as the Purchaser or Acquirer, does not comply with these requirements, TPCG may, at its sole discretion, and without notice to Purchaser or Acquirer, file a cause of action to recapture and obtain ownership of the property or file an executory cause of action to cause the seizure and sale of the property. Further, in the event TPCG brings such cause of action, all sums paid by Purchaser and any and all improvements made by Purchaser to the property shall be forfeited as stipulated damages. To the fullest extent allowed by law, TPCG shall have the right to reasonable attorneys fees and costs associated with such action. The Terrebonne Parish legal department shall include terms and conditions in the document which transfers this property to Purchaser or Acquirer to facilitate the enforcement of such remedies. In addition to this and the other terms and conditions listed herein, TPCG may impose on the winning bidder, otherwise known as the Purchaser, such further requirements as it may deem appropriate in accordance with La. R.S. 47:2204. Such further requirements shall comply with the federal and state constitutions, federal and state law, and the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government Code of Ordinances.

SECTION V

Individuals who have previously been non-compliant in nuisance violations against their property, as identified by the Terrebonne Parish Nuisance Abatement Director, are barred from bidding on and purchasing this adjudicated property. Individuals who have failed to complete and comply with a prior adjudicated property purchase after being awarded the bid to purchase are barred from bidding on and purchasing this adjudicated property.

SECTION VI

By acquiring a bid packet for the bid/purchase of this adjudicated property, each bidder acknowledges that he/she/it has received all information discussed in this ordinance as well as the statutes (laws) discussed in Section II above, and that he/she/it understands these procedures must be followed in order to fully protect he/she/its rights in the adjudicated property purchased from the parish.





AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE AN ADDITIONAL AD VALOREM TAX EXEMPTION OF UP TO \$2,500 OF THE ASSESSED VALUATION OF PROPERTY RECEIVING HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION THAT IS OWNED AND OCCUPIED BY A QUALIFIED FIRST RESPONDER PURSUANT TO ARTICLE VII, SECTION 21(O) OF THE LOUISIANA CONSTITUTION.

WHEREAS, in its 2023 Regular Session, the Louisiana Legislature passed Act No. 179 which proposed an amendment to the Louisiana Constitution to authorize the local governing authority of a parish to provide an ad valorem tax exemption for qualified first responders (as defined therein); and

WHEREAS, the electors of the State of Louisiana at the statewide election held on November 18, 2023, approved the proposed constitutional amendment which added Article VII, Section 21(O); and



WHEREAS, the Houma Police Department received \$11,979 reimbursement for damages that occurred to Unit #328, and

WHEREAS, this reimbursement needs to be reflected in the Auto and Truck Repairs account.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Terrebonne Parish Council, on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government, that the 2024 Adopted Operating Budget be amended for the Houma Police Department. (Attachment A)

SECTION II

WHEREAS, the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government has received additional funding of \$60,000 allocated by the state for improvements to the HVAC systems for low to moderate income publicly owned community facilities from the Office of Community Development (OCD), and

WHEREAS, it has been reported that the Schriever, Gibson, and Church Street Head Start facilities are in dire need of new/upgraded HVAC systems, and

WHEREAS, each of these items can be obtained through the Parish on behalf of these facilities utilizing CARES act funding from OCD.

#### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE IV, CHAPTER 18, OF THE TERREBONNE PARISH CODE, SECTION 18-91 TO ADD BAYOUSIDE DRIVE TO THE TWENTY-FIVE (25) MILES PER HOUR REGULATIONS

#### **SECTION I**

WHEREAS, Section 1-06 of the Home Rule Charter for Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government (TPCG) provides that the Parish Government shall have the right, power and authority to pass all ordinances requisite or necessary to promote, protect and preserve the general welfare, safety, health, peace and good order of the parish, including but not by way of limitation, the right, power and authority to pass ordinances on all subject matters necessary requisite or proper for the management of parish affairs, and all other subject matters without exception, subject only to the limitation that the same shall not be inconsistent with the Constitution or expressly denied by general law applicable to the parish; and

**WHEREAS,** Section 2-11 of the Terrebonne Parish Home Rule Charter requires an ordinance to adopt or amend an administrative code; and

**WHEREAS**, there have been safety issues on Bayouside Drive regarding construction vehicles traveling on the narrow roads at high speeds; and

**WHEREAS,** TPCG wishes to lower the speed limit on Bayouside Drive for large trucks, dump trucks, box trucks, and tractor trailers, only;

WHEREAS, TPCG is in need of adopting Article IV, Chapter 18, Section 18-91 to add locations to the twenty-five (25) miles per hour regulations on Bayouside Drive for vehicles listed above and having a total weight in excess of ten (10) tons.

#### **SECTION II**

WHEREAS, Section 1-06 of the Home Rule Charter for Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government (TPCG) provides that the Parish Government shall have the right, power and authority to pass all ordinances requisite or necessary to promote, protect and preserve the general welfare, safety, health, peace and good order of the parish, including but not by way of limitation, the right, power and authority to pass ordinances on all subject matters necessary requisite or proper for the management of parish affairs, and all other subject matters without exception, subject only to the limitation that the same shall not be inconsistent with the Constitution or expressly denied by general law applicable to the parish; and

WHEREAS, Section 2-11 of the Terrebonne Parish Home Rule Charter requires an ordinance to adopt or amend an administrative code; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 8865 was passed on July 27, 2017, de-dedicating the 40-foot wide unimproved portion of Katherine Street between the eastern right-of-way of Pecan Street, to its terminus at the Gulf Intracoastal Waterway, which was filed for record with the Terrebonne Parish Recorder of Conveyances on November 8, 2018, at COB 2555, page 51, Entry No. 1570154. ("de-dedicated land"); and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 8865 was inadvertently vague and did not specify the party benefiting from the de-dedication of the land, which has created title issues for the de-dedicated land; and

WHEREAS, jurisprudence tells us that when a parish de-dedicates land, the ownership of the property underlying the roads or streets that have been dedicated to public use and are no longer needed for such purposes, is transferred to the contiguous landowners (*U.S. Silica Co. v. Wooldridge*, 799 So.2d 693 (2001)). This transfer occurs up to the center line of the said roads, streets, or alleyways. *Id.*; and

WHEREAS, TPCG and the owner of the contiguous properties of the de-dedicated land would like to clarify Ordinance No. 8865 by designating the party that the title transferred to after the land was de-dedicated, resolving any title issues as to the owner of the de-dedicated land; and

#### **SECTION II**

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Terrebonne Parish Council on behalf of the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government that the following Ordinance No. 8865 shall be and is hereby amended, with underline to show additions:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED that the Terrebonne Parish Council, in regular session convened, acting pursuant to the authority vested in it by the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, and pursuant to the Home Rule Charter for a Consolidated Government, does hereby revoke the dedication of the 40 foot wide unimproved portion of Katherine Street between the eastern right-of-way of Pecan Street to its terminus at the Gulf Intracoastal Waterway, more specifically located between 410 and 420 Pecan Street located within Connely Subdivision as depicted on Exhibit "A" attached hereto. The ownership of the property underlying the dedicated street is transferred to the contiguous landowner(s), each up to the center line of the said de-dedicated portion of Katherine Street, all in accordance with the relevant jurisprudence. U.S. Silica Co. v. Wooldridge, 799 So.2d 693 (2001).

The Terrebonne Parish Recorder of Mortgages and Conveyances is hereby requested and directed to make note of this Ordinance in the margin of the original (Entry No. 1570154), to serve as occasion may require.
